In the month of October, the students in French Immersion Kindergarten spent a lot of time developing numeracy skills. They are learning to count

to 20 in French and are working on representing numbers to 10 by drawing, building, and using manipulatives. Bravo!







#### Room 105 - Mrs. Galbraith

Our room has been very busy this October! We spent a lot of time talking about fall and how trees change in this season. We created a lot of art related to fall trees.

In math, we started learning a lot about patterns. We made lots of Halloween patterns with sound, movement, colours, shapes, toys and stamps. One of our favorites patterns was, "banana, banana, meatball," from GoNoodle.

One of our favorite ELA activities was when we made our own creepy carrots after reading the book Creepy Carrots by Aaron Reynolds. They turned out super creepy! We now know the sound that creepy carrots make when they are creeping up behind you..."Tunk, Tunk, Tunk!"

#### Room 201 - Mme Vermeulen

In French, we have been singing songs such as 'Dans Mon Panier' and learning the vowels with songs such as 'AEIOU'. We have been practicing our alphabet sounds and recognizing

> them within words. In Science, we have been learning about bats and comparing bats and birds. In Math, we have been continuing with counting, number recognition, addition and estimating.

#### Room 207 - Mme Arnold

Our room has been learning about bats. They have been learning about a bat's life cycle, habitat and how they are different from birds. The students have been learning about the Little Brown Bat as it is a common bat found in Manitoba. Students have also been practicing their addition/subtraction skills, counting skills as well as developing their

number sense with 2 digit numbers. In French, we have been learning the "ou", "ch" and "eau" sounds.


#### Room 304 - M. Asselin






parents join in.


