French: In French, we've been focusing on developing our oral language skills. Through daily morning classroom introduction, students have been building both their confidence and stamina in speaking French with the goal of creating a strong sense of classroom community. Moreover, we've seen colors in French and discovered some words of vocabulary in the classroom. For instance: tableau, jeu, chaise, pupitre, table... Also, we've been focusing on vowels "a" and "A", "E" and "e", with "é" and "É", "I", "i", "O" and "o", "U" and "u".

Sciences: In Sciences, we've begun our unit on "la communauté locale". Students have listed some of important services we need in the society, around of us and have been able to draw one of these services and draw the members of their families.

Maths: We've begun our unit on "Numbers". We've worked on the best way of writing different numbers such as : 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 9 and especially the right sense of these numbers. Also, we've seen the "addition facts" to realize that "2+2" is the same as "4+0" and "3+1" before starting additions.

Health: exchange about importance to brush teeth.

Room 207 - Mme Arnold


September has been a wonderful start to the school year in Room 207! We began by reviewing the French alphabet and letter sounds and learning to read some French sight words. In math, students practiced

Take a look at Room 206 Math Centres Monday's. Each Monday morning the students from room 206 participate in game base learning through math centres.







Hello parents and guardians of 301. We've positively hit the ground running this September. It's been a month of getting to know one another, establishing routines, learning, and having some fun.

In French we've been establishing routines through verb work, re-visiting vocabulary and practicing written and verbal applications of the present and past tense. Students have been reading individually, with partners, and with myself, and I get to know their needs and learning goals.

We've covered a great deal in math, including number patterns, input/output machines, mental math strategies, and an introduction to algebra and multi-step operations.

Our ELA focuses have included an introduction to oral presentations through TUSC (Totally Unique Speaking Club), explicit reading instruction in groups, and practicing vowel and diphthong sounds through spelling vocabulary.

The students have begun learning about and experimenting with electricity in science, where we have used materials to experiment and develop hypotheses around static electricity, and begun discussing electrical current and the daily needs that electricity helps us fulfill.

In social studies, the students will be researching important events that led to the confederation of Canada and sharing multimedia presentations with the class.

Finally, rooms 301 and 308 are collaborating on a presentation for our upcoming assembly to share with the school. I'll keep that under wraps for the time being, but we look forward to sharing something that's developed by students to share with peers and guests that reflects one of our school's core values.

I am so impressed with students from 311. Right from day 1, they began speaking in French with less prompting than I would have normally expected at this time of the year. Bravo! Review of last year's material, particularly in Math, is going very well. Routines are being reestablished, and we are off exploring new subjects. A unit in Rocks and Minerals has begun and we are beginning to explore Canada by learning the names of our capitals, provinces and territories. All in all, it has been a great start!



Our Riverview students are off to a wonderful new year of learning together in music class.

Our nursery and kindergarten students will be able to spend time learning and growing together in the music room. It is wonderful that they are able to include music class in their schedule this year.

This month we expanded our choral skills with the song "Who You Share it With" by the Alternative/Indie group Layup. The lyrics of the song remind us that the people we spend our time with are our family. The time we share together with others is what makes life a special and wonderful thing. We will be joining together to sing this song as a school community at the end of the October assembly.

Activities in September in the music room have included game play, exploration of the unpitched percussion instruments with our younger students and work on rhythm reading with the older children.

An awesome group of 93 grades 3-6 students have started work this past month on our musical which will be presented in May. They will spend many hours working individually and as a group as soloists, actors and chorus to present the production of "Seussical the Musical Jr." We look forward to growing our skills and shaping the production in what is sure to be a memorable show.

A group of 38 grades 5 & 6 students have begun work on a special choral selection for our Remembrance Day assembly.

TABS FOR WHEELCHAIRS

This year our school will be partnering with over 190 schools, 310 companies and hundreds of individuals to collect drink can tabs. Once collected, these tabs will be sold to Western Scrap Metal and the money collected will go towards the purchase of a specialized wheel chair for a wonderful child in Manitoba.

This year's recipient is Delainey. She is 13 years old and in grade 6 at Stonybrook Middle School in Steinbach. She is the oldest sibling to two younger sisters and a

younger brother. She was diagnosed at three weeks old with a very rare chromosome disorder known as Trisomy 13 or Patau syndrome. 90% of children born with this genetic disorder pass away before their 1" birthday. Delainey was born with multiple holes in her heart, one blind eye, a cleft lip and palate, scoliosis and chronic cystic kidney disease. She is non-mobile and nonverbal, but is an extremely expressive young lady. Despite the negative prognosis, Delainey is a medical miracle as she continues to beat all the odds stacked against her and lives her best life. She is a very happy and affectionate girl and brings lots of joy and laughter to the lives of those she meets! Delainey loves to greet everyone with a "hello" and "high fives"! She loves school, especially phys ed, bus rides, her EA's, and is very much loved by her peers! Other favorites of hers are car rides, music, and she is a major foodie!!!

We invite all students and staff to start collecting drink can tabs. Tabs may be given to the classroom teacher. It will be our great honour to play a small part in the presentation to Delainey of her very own specialized wheelchair in 2026.

Socktober 2025

Socktober is an annual awareness and giving campaign, traditionally held in October, that encourages people to collect and donate new socks to homeless shelters and individuals experiencing homelessness. The movement, started by Brad Montague in 2011 after he realized socks were a greatly needed but rarely donated item, has grown into a global initiative for kindness and community support, with the simple goal of "Socks + October" to provide warmth and comfort to those in need.

Main Street Project is an organization where people experiencing homelessness can go and find comfort. Many of the folks at Main Street Project spend a lot of time on their feet, often walking several hours a day in ill-fitting shoes, and they often don't have access to a

shower to clean their feet with the opportunity to change into clean, dry socks. We want to do everything we can to help keep these folks healthy over the coming winter months by being able to provide
new socks.
