## What's going on around the school!

## Ce qui se passe autour de l'école! LA MATERNELLE

Mme Brown | salle 103
It has been a busy September in French Immersion Kindergarten as our classroom settles in to routines!


In math, the students have been learning about number recognition in French and representing quantities using tally marks, dice, and manipulatives.


This month in room 105, Nursery/Kindergarten English we have been working on being independent, learning routines and making friends! Students are learning to play kindly and share with each other as well as how to respectfully sit and listen as a group, and independently to learn together. Ms. Nikky


The students in room 201 have been working on establishing classroom routines. Students have been working hard at learning the French alphabet through song and practice along with common words and various short phrases used most often in class. In Math, we have been working on patterning using pictures, sounds, actions and manipulatives. We have also been counting by 1 s and we have explored representing the number 10 using cubes. Next month, we will be starting our first science unit and we will be learning all about spiders.

In room 204 we have been building community and practicing the daily routines of the class. We have spent time sorting and comparing collections and sharing what we know about numbers and patterns. We do daily read to self and are working on sharing ideas through writing and drawing.


Room 207 has been learning/reviewing the French alphabet with many songs, poems and games. Students began the school year making many colourful and seasonal patterns. Students have been practicing counting using manipulatives and making groups of $2 \mathrm{~s}, 5 \mathrm{~s}$ and 10 s . We will begin October learning about spiders and starting our

Welcome to Room 209! This month, our class has focused on reviewing last year's learning, developing strong routines and making new friends. We have started our study of Canada and working on writing scary stories

En éducation physique / In Physical Education we have been reconnecting after our summer apart, establishing expected behaviours through movement and revisiting physical literacy skills in cooperative activities and games. Mme Wolfe

Room 301 has gotten off to a great start this September. Students have been working with vertical, nonpermanent surfaces in Math as they learn about number patterns, participating in group research and discussion of planets in Science, and combining verb work with creative writing in French. ELA will have the students begin a group novel study in mid-September. Finally, we've got a spooktacular student-led arts project in the works. More news to follow in October.

This month, the students of room 304 have learned to work together with people they've just met. In groups, they started a project on making a country and one on writing a digital Choose Your Own Adventure story.

Students in room 307 have been learning to follow routines such as transitioning quickly and choosing good working spots as well as developing the stamina to work without taking breaks. Our big project has been learning about the provincial election and we will be hosting a student vote on September 29th.

Les élèves en 3 e et 4 e année de la salle 309...Ok! Ok! I will continue in English! Students in 309 are adapting and adjusting to new routines, increased français, increased responsibilities, and various expectations (such as increased time on task/gaining stamina), and grade 3s are also experiencing an increase in fitness (due to additional stair climbing/descending to and from the third floor). Among many other things, we are learning about our BRAIN (notre CERVEAU); about anxiety and strategies to calm it; about Canadian heroes; and about democracy in Canada, through "Student Vote - Manitoba".

September was a busy month in room $\mathbf{3 1 0}$ ! In science we have been learning about how different plants and animals adapt to their habitats. In Canada, many trees have adapted to the weather by losing their leaves in the fall. In art we painted deciduous trees and made our own maple leaf fossils out of clay.


The students of Salle 311 are working hard: adjusting to new routines, reviewing their math knowledge, learning about the election candidates and working on building up their reading and writing stamina. Their cerebral gears have been oiled and they are doing a great job of clicking their brains to "Français".
