Engaged, Confident, Inspired, and Successful Learners.



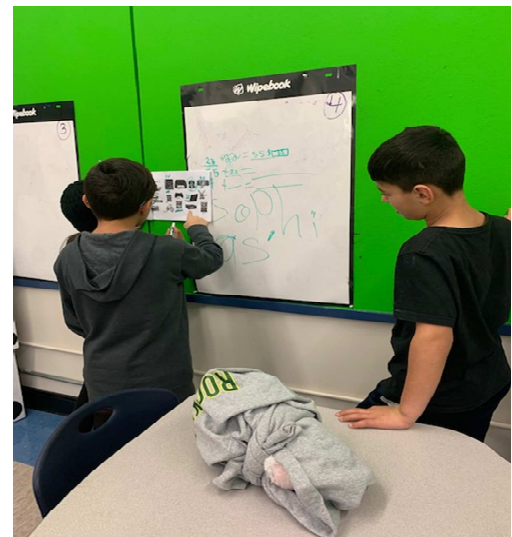
About our school

Communication between school and home is an essential element of the Rockwood School community. Our school handbook serves to assist with daily function of the school. School reminders and colander of events are sent out on a regular basis via School messenger. This year the students are involved and have ownership of the newsletter which is sent out 2 times a year. This has provided an opportunity for students to have an opportunity to write for a purpose and for an audience. See saw and Google classrooms are now commonly used as alternative way to connect with students and families to celebrate learning. The Rockwood website offers school wide information as well as Parent Advisory Council and divisional links. Classroom teachers regularly send home specific information, as well. Lastly our school's reader board, located above the gym doorway (near the office), provides daily reminders of life at Rockwood School.
