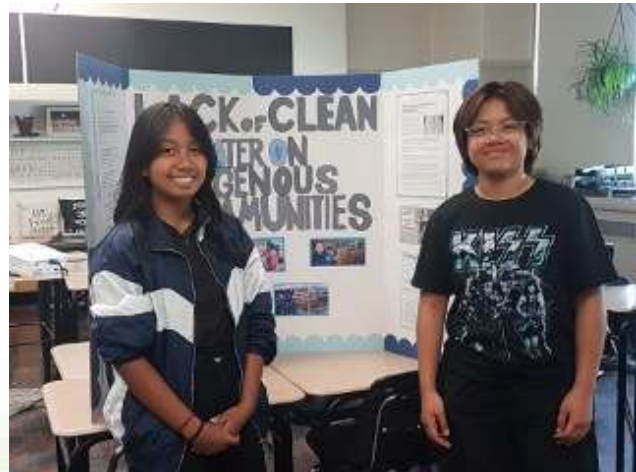
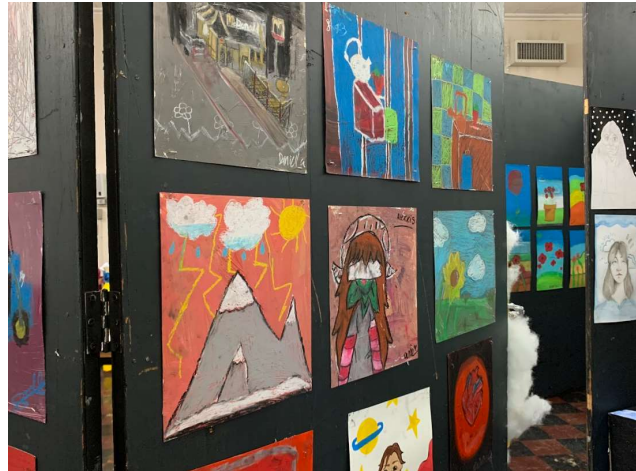
About our school

2. Writing:

- Elementary – Word choice and organization
- Junior/Senior High – Structure and organization

3. Numeracy:

- Elementary – Algebraic Reasoning (Patterns and Relations), Application of Knowledge and Modelling/Communicating Thinking
- Junior/Senior High – Transfer learned concepts and apply when problem solving

4. Indigenous Education:

- Strengthen understanding of Indigenous practices and embed new knowledge into student experiences

5. Safe and Caring Schools

- Increase sense of belonging and identity for all

6. Executive Functioning

- Develop students understanding of executive functioning skills in order to improve student learning
