## Absence Reporting

Just a reminder that Shaughnessy Park School uses the Safe Arrival system to notify parents of student absences. We are working towards having all absences recorded by parents so they do not receive phone calls. With Safe Arrival, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance by using any of these methods:

**1** Using a mobile device, download and install the School Messenger app from the Apple Store or the Google Play Store. The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance, then Report an Absence.

2 Use the Safe Arrival website, http://go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.

**3** Call the toll-free number 1-855-278-4513 to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Absences can be reported at any time.

Just a reminder that the breakfast program is open daily from 8:15 am until 8:45 am. Children will be going outside after breakfast. Please make sure to dress for the weather.

### WALKING SCHOOL BUS


Please have children ready at the door and dressed for the weather by 8:25 AM.

#### WITH MS. DELARONDE

Several of our grade six, seven and eight students alongside Laura, our school social worker, Lori our LST, Landen with student support, and Ron a student teacher with the CATEP program, have been embracing the opportunity to spend time on the land. Students have embraced outdoor cooking, harvesting materials for fire making, medicine, and sweat lodge and fire keeping teachings. In one way or another, all of these teachings have been connected back to curricular outcomes, through both oral and written reflection.

Several of our young men have received fire teachings, how to harvest materials with limited tools in new spaces from Ron, while the rest of us focused our time on learning how to relax, breathe, and be present in our current spaces. We discussed where we are going, and how to move ourselves forward effectively. We spoke about best practices of Mino-bimaadiziwin  $\Gamma_{\Delta} \Delta \Gamma \Delta^{e}$  'The good life' as we enjoyed barbecue cook outs of hamburgers, cheeseburgers, smokies and hotdogs, with plenty of snacks and refreshments. These days always end with some fulfilled play. It has been amazing to see our students learning from the land.












## STUDIENT COUNCIL
