# The French Immersion Program in Manitoba



### WHAT IS THE FRENCH IMMERSION PROGRAM IN MANITOBA?

- A K to 12 **bilingual education** in which students whose first language is not French receive most of their instruction in French in order to learn the language.
- An integration of language and content-area instruction in which students learn to communicate in French while learning most subjects in French.
- French, the language of instruction, is the means of communication in the classroom and throughout the school.

### WHAT IS THE VISION OF THE FRENCH IMMERSION PROGRAM?


The French Immersion Program develops proud, confident, engaged, plurilingual global citizens.


The French Immersion Program enables students to


- interact spontaneously, autonomously, and confidently in French

- foster openness to other languages and cultures


### WHO IS THE FRENCH IMMERSION PROGRAM FOR?


French Immersion is an inclusive program intended for **ALL students** with various abilities and needs whose first language is not French and who have little or no knowledge of the French language.











### WHEN CAN A STUDENT ENTER THE FRENCH IMMERSION PROGRAM?

### The most common official entry point in Manitoba:

Early Immersion – Kindergarten or Grade 1

## Depending on the school division, other official entry points in Manitoba may include:

Middle Immersion – Grade 4

Late Immersion – Grade 6 or 7

Flexible entry points

### WHAT ARE THE INSTRUCTION TIMES AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS?

GRADE GROUPING	% OF INSTRUCTION TIME IN FRENCH
Kindergarten	100%
Grades 1–6	75–80%
Grades 7–8	50–86%
Grades 9–12 Minimum Graduation Requirements	Minimum 15/30 credits in French  • Grade 9 – min. 4 credits  • Grade 10 – min. 4 credits  • Grade 11 – min. 3 or 4 credits  • Grade 12 – min. 3 or 4 credits

### FRENCH IMMERSION IN MANITOBA BY THE NUMBERS

The French Immersion Program began in Manitoba in 1973 with 50 students, and 50 years later we have

- 28,023 students
- 1,500 teachers
- 23 school divisions offering the French Immersion Program
- 115 French immersion schools (43 single track and 72 dual track)
