- French Language Learning: New vocabulary, a variety of French texts, verbs, and grammar will be integrated naturally into our projects and daily routines.
- Truth and Reconciliation: We will read texts by Indigenous authors, learn about local history, and practice allyship through projects and discussions.
- Science: Inquiry and experimentation will help us see ourselves as scientists, making connections between ecosystems, sustainability, and Indigenous knowledge systems.
- English: We will examine a variety of texts, multimodal texts, and writing forms that allow students to discover new genres and deepen their appreciation of literature.

This school year holds so much promise, and I look forward to working in partnership with you as we guide students in exploring new ideas and developing their unique interests.
