SHOOLMESSENGER® SAFE ARRIVAL

At Winnipeg School Division, one of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely at school each and every day.

To enhance our existing absence-checking procedure, we are introducing a more efficient student absence reporting system called SafeArrival. This system will reduce the time it takes to verify student attendance, make it easy for you to report your child's absence and easy for staff to respond to unexplained student absences.

With SafeArrival, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these $\mathbf{3}$ convenient methods:

Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
Use the SafeArrival website, https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
Call the toll-free number 1-855-278-4513 to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time. You must call the system before 9:00 AM if your child is going to be away that day. Otherwise the system will call you.

Starting Wednesday, September 6, 2023, please report absences in advance using SafeArrival instead of sending notes or calling/emailing the school.

If you do not call the system to report your child's absence, the system will be calling you!

## SISTER MACNAMARA'S LUNCH PROGRAM

## Lunch Program is getting underway!

> Lunch Program is a service provided for parents who are either working or attending school. In order to qualify for the Lunch Program you must be able to provide proof of either when filling out an application. Please note that when you sign up for lunch program, you are responsible to pay for each month regardless of your child's attendance. There is often a waiting list and if you do not pay your fees, your child will lose the spot and it will be passed on to someone on the waiting list.
> Fees are 30.00 per month for the first child and 20.00 per month for each additional child. Fees are cash only and due at the first of each month. Please send exact amounts as we cannot make change.
> Parents are expected to provide a healthy lunch, including a healthy beverage. (no junk food or pop please!)

We expect all students attending the lunch program to demonstrate proper behavior following the school and Lunch. Program expectations: Be Respectful, Be Responsible, and Be Safe. If your child has any behavioral problems during the lunch program, you will be notified by either a phone call or a letter.

We understand that occasionally families that are not in the lunch program might need to have their child stay for lunch. If that occasion arises, please call Ning, the lunch program coordinator, at least $\mathbf{2 4}$ hours in advance to make arrangements. Drop in fees will apply.

Also, a big thank you to all the lunch program staff for doing a wonderful job of ensuring your children are well taken care of during the lunch hour.

Our school held its annual Terry Fox Run on September 22. Due to weather and field conditions, we held the event indoors. Students came to the gym and did a Terry Fox inspired workout in which they learned a fact about Terry Fox and then did an exercise connected to that fact. In the morning we had a whole school assembly celebrating Terry Fox and his Marathon of Hope. Rooms 206, 226, and 228 shared their Terry Fox learning with the school, which took great courage and strength to do. A big thank you to those rooms for highlighting the learning that goes on in your classrooms!

The month of September we also talked about what physical education looked like in Residential Schools. Students looked at photographs and discussed what role physical education played during Residential Schools and what kinds of games and activities Indigenous students were allowed to play. We then discussed the role of physical education in our school and the kinds of games, sports, and activities we play and what those activities teach us.
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If your child was born in 2019, they are eligible to start Nursery this September! If they were born in 2018, they are eligible to start Kindergarten. Nursery and Kindergarten are half day classes either in the morning or afternoon.

The registration form is on the Sister MacNamara website. You are welcome to fill it in and send it in electronically. If you fill it in, please phone the school to make an appointment to bring your child's ID in to the office. You are also welcome to call the school or come to the school to register.

In order to register your child you will need 3 things:

- Your child's birth certificate
- Manitoba Health card
- A lease or tenant agreement OR a tax assessment letter to validate your address.
