PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING COURSE REQUIREMENTS CAREFULLY BEFORE COMPLETING THE APPLICATION FORM.

Total credits required for graduate totals 30 in both Academic and Technical Vocational programs. 18 credits are compulsory. 12 additional credits must be taken to meet the requirements for a high school diploma. At Tec-Voc there are two diploma programs:

- 1. Technical-Vocational Diploma: 8 credits in a specified Technical program plus the academic requirement
- 2. Academic Diploma: Standard provincial curriculum

Students have the unique opportunity to complete both diplomas at the same time. The resulting diplomas allow students to enter university, community college, apprenticeship training, and/or employment. For more information please speak to a Tec-Voc counsellor.
