

## **Parent and Community Involvement**



 Tec-Voc's Fair Trade & Sustainability Committee presented a Farm & Fair Trade Spirit Week. A week that celebrates our designation as well as our connections to our local farmers. Our sponsorship for this event had been nothing but amazing. All proceeds went to support the youth meal programs and the Tec-Voc Scholarship Fund.
