

Earlier this year, teacher Vance Halldorson seized the opportunity to take on a student-built prop, created entirely of motorcycle parts, for the feature film, 1989. The filming takes place May 15 through mid-June, 2023, in and around Winnipeg including scenes at Tec-Voc high school.

The opportunity came about while film production team was scouting the Tec-Voc welding shop location and saw some of the incredible project's students were working on. A question was asked if they would be interested in making something for the movie, knowing the value of having students involved in community projects, Halldorson immediately accepted the project.

Upon consulting with Tec-Voc administration, the "1989" film production team and the IATSE Local 856, Halldorson connected with movie production designer Richard Simpson, who developed the concept of what the project would look like.

Students were presented with the idea of a throne that is made entirely from motorcycle parts, taking inspiration from the Mad Max movies and the Game of Thrones series.

Once all the parts were delivered to Tec-Voc, the build began. Tec-Voc welders welded all the parts in place and the electrical was prepared by Tec-Voc electrical department. Taking only a few weeks with the help of many students and one very dedicated student, Katryn C., who worked every lunch hour, the completed throne was done.

I thought the design could bring out our history and generational trauma, bring it to light, and help us remember what happened and how many people were lost. I designed the older owl holding the younger owl. This represents the older generation protecting the younger generation."
