The Equipment Library project aims to acquire various outdoor living equipment and supplies to be utilized over multiple excursions by both student and family. The availability of the equipment dramatically decreases the cost of excursions, allowing for access to free accommodations rather than resident facilities. The project will enhance the piloted Land-Based Learning Course in grade 7 and 8, a student-centered activity focused program designed to enhance the participant's learning ability, cultural and environmental awareness, self-confidence, and self-discipline. Student learning in the course includes utilizing the outdoors as a classroom, respecting the environment, the value of Indigenous perspectives and incorporate skills to live an active and healthy lifestyle. The Land-Based Learning course is focused on grades 7 and 8 students. The Land-based equipment can be available to other students and families.
