1)Math and Literacy

programming to follow Read To Me framework to support reading instruction and Thinking Classroom model to support math instruction. Students receive small group targeted instruction one hour per day at their level. Strengthen instructional and assessment strategies for all students using all available resources including the integration of technology.

Examples:

Reading Framework in Grade 1-3 including integration of Smart TVs, Chromebooks, and IPads for all areas of instruction.

2) Improve academic and behavior support services for special needs students.

Priorities for 2023-2024

School priorities for the upcoming school year

1) Numeracy Programming – Thinking Classrooms and STEAM programming to increase students' modeling and communicating mathematical learning.

Examples:

- 1) Targeted instruction that embeds differentiation and adaptations to ensure success.
- 2) Engaging real life problem solving through STEAM and Number Talks.
- 3) Tier 2 math instruction.
- 2) Improve academic and behavior support services for all students.

Examples:

- 1) Continue to create, review, and revise Behavior Intervention Plans.
- 2) Create proactive student success plans.
- 3) Continue to strengthen social emotional programming throughout all classrooms.
- Continue to strengthen and enhance Education for Sustainable Development initiatives that address environmental, societal and economic issues world-wide.

- 1) School treaty-continue to focus on oral story telling.
- Continue the expansion of the Community Garden Project (adding garden boxes/create an outdoor garden play area), create outdoor learning kits for classrooms.
- 3) Continue to work on improving school attendance through the exploration of additional programs and strategies.

- 2) Staff Professional Development continuation of trauma informed practices in the school.
