- Improve student outcomes in literacy through refined teaching practices, feedback, self-assessment and establishing criteria and expectations to increase student stamina and engagement in specific literacy behaviors.

- Utilize Professional Learning Communities to engage in moderated practice, reflect on data, collaborate, plan and implement strategies and lessons based on data.
