
# École secondaire Kelvin High School Community Report 2022-2023

Teachers provide a learning environment that promotes and fosters growth in each individual student. They provide opportunities for students to develop and to extend their knowledge, skills, and values in the global world. Staff, parents and volunteers bring a spectrum of services and expertise to help ensure the success of all students.
