About our school

Kent Road School is a Nursery to Grade 6 school serving families in the East Elmwood community. The school population consists of 252 children in a multicultural community where approximately 27% of the students come from homes where a language other than English is spoken, and 52% of the student population has self-identified as Indigenous. There are 14 Teachers and 14 Educational Assistants, and Michelle Sacco is the principal.

Children are challenged daily in their academic subjects, also benefitting from enrichment and adaptations as needed.

This year, it was wonderful to re-engage in normal school activities including assemblies, intramurals, field trips and so much more.






Priorities for 2022-23

1. Literacy

4. Indigenous Education

- Teachers will continue to embed Indigenous perspectives across all curricular areas.
- ◆ Staff and students will continue to work with Knowledge Keepers to inform our practices and deepen our understanding.

5. Professional Learning

- Teachers will continue to strengthen their practices to support the diverse population of learners with a focus on literacy, numeracy, inclusion and diversity.
- Through Professional Learning Communities, Professional Learning and WSD support staff we will continue to identify needs and implement strategies for student success.

Parent and community involvement

The Kent Road Parent Council works closely with the school administration to support all areas of the school. The Parent Council meets approximately 5 times per year in the evenings to promote parental involvement at the school. They also offer a supervised lunch program for students whose parents work or live a fair distance from the school. Any parent or guardian of Kent Road students is welcome to join.
