Priorities for 2022-23

Literacy Goal: By the end of June 2023, 80% of all students will be reading and writing at or above grade level. The workshop model and the Reading and Writing Units of Study will be the school wide approach to teaching literacy.

Numeracy Goal: By the end of June 2023, 80% of all students will be at or above grade level in mathematics. Thinking Classrooms and Number Talks will be the school wide approach for the teaching of mathematics.

Mino-Bimaadiziwin Goal: By the end of June 2023, each classroom will engage in a Roots and Shoots 4 step model that focuses on Truth and Reconciliation while supporting positive change for people, animals and the environment in the Elmwood community.

Safe and Caring Goal: By the end of June 2023, 80% of all students will be using proactive strategies to engage in learning and following school expectations (Be safe, Be Respectful, Be Cooperative). Students will have an increased understanding and awareness of Indigenous ways of knowing and inclusive practices.

By the end of June 2024, 80% of all students will read and write at or above grade level.

Numeracy Goal:

By the end of June 2024, 80% of all students will perform at or above grade level in mathematics.

Mino-Bimaadiziwin Goal:

To help our students achieve the good life by strengthening our collective understanding of indigenous ways of knowing, doing, and being, so that they can be embedded into everything we do.

Safe and Caring Goal:

By the end of June 2024, 80% of students will use proactive strategies to engage in learning and be provided with ways to see themselves as healthy and productive Lord Selkirk School community members and global citizens.
