

About our school

Norquay is a public elementary school in Winnipeg, Manitoba. The school is located in the North Point Douglas Community and enrolls approximately 210 students from nursery to grade six. It is one of 78 schools within the Winnipeg School Division. Norquay offers a variety of English programs and has an Adapted Skills Program from grades K-6. Norquay promotes the infusion of Indigenous perspectives and cultural practices within the classroom and school community.

Norquay is an RTI (Response to Intervention) and Restorative Practices based school that provides opportunity for all learners. We also have a Special Education Resource Team, Community Support Worker, Food Coordinator and a 21 Leadership program. We offer Lunch/supervision program for families that need support over the lunch hour. There are a variety of after-school programs offered at the school on a daily basis for students and parents.

Norquay supports divisional early intervention Literacy and Numeracy programming, Reggie Routeman (Writing Process), Community Schools Investigators program, Boys and Girls Club, "Talk to Me" Project (Program for all Nursery and Kindergarten students), and the Home Reading Program N-6. These are just some of the social skills and academic programs offered at Norquay.
