## Priorities for the next year - 2022- 2023

At Principal Sparling School we believe it is important to focus on academic learning. We will use our Provincial Continuous Improvement Plan to support teaching and learning at all grades. Our priorities for 2022-2023 school year are:

#### Indigenous Education & Education for Sustainable Development (ESD)

Moving forward in Reconciliation, we will continue to integrate and prioritize Indigenous perspectives in the classroom. We will continue to expand on The Turtle Garden to support the future of an outdoor learning classroom. The Turtle Garden will continue to be woven into teaching opportunities for classrooms.

#### **ELA: Reading & Writing**

The Winnipeg School Division continuums continues to support and reinforce the success of student writing. Writing assessments which occur three times during the year provide evidence of student growth.

The grade 3 Provincial Assessment in reading will be used as a baseline for planning to support the three sub competences in reading at all grade levels:

Reflects on and sets reading goals

Uses strategies during reading to make sense of texts

Demonstrates comprehension

#### Math

The Winnipeg School Division Learning Pathway and Grade 3 Provincial Assessment in Math continues to support planning for students. Dialogue in the four sub competences in Math will support consistent pedagogy in classrooms insuring success for students.

Predicts an element in a repeating pattern

Understanding that the equal symbol represents an equality of the term found on either side of the symbol

Understands that a given whole number may be represented in a variety of ways (to 100)

Uses various mental math strategies to determine answers to addition and subtraction questions
