Robertson School is an inclusive community providing quality education for all students in a safe, caring environment from Nursery to Grade 6.

Our school prides itself on offering specialized and inclusive programming for students in the Skills for Independent Living Programs (formally Life Skills), and Autism Programs. Robertson School continues to embrace an inclusive school culture. When working on independent, group, or whole class activities, all students regardless of their ability are equitably involved in the learning process. A culture of professional learning has been cultivated over time that truly reflects our school belief that we are a "Community of Learners Working Together." Robertson school has approximately 346 students, 58 staff members, an active Parent Council, daily lunch program and a Before and After School Program. We are partners with our supportive parent community who are an integral part of the students' educational lives. Robertson School, as an inclusive education school, focuses on building on peoples' strengths. In this environment, all students develop self-worth and are provided with opportunities for meaningful involvement in learning. We work to ensure that every individual feels accepted and valued and safe.

## **More Highlights**

- Staff & Student Volunteers provided valuable support of Mobile Vision Clinic, Picture Day, Hearing Screening, Immunizations.
- Robertson School community and Parent-Council supported the funding for classroom field trips, Grade 5/6 Camp, Grade 5/6 Farewell, treats for students, classroom supplies, etc.
