# Planetarium

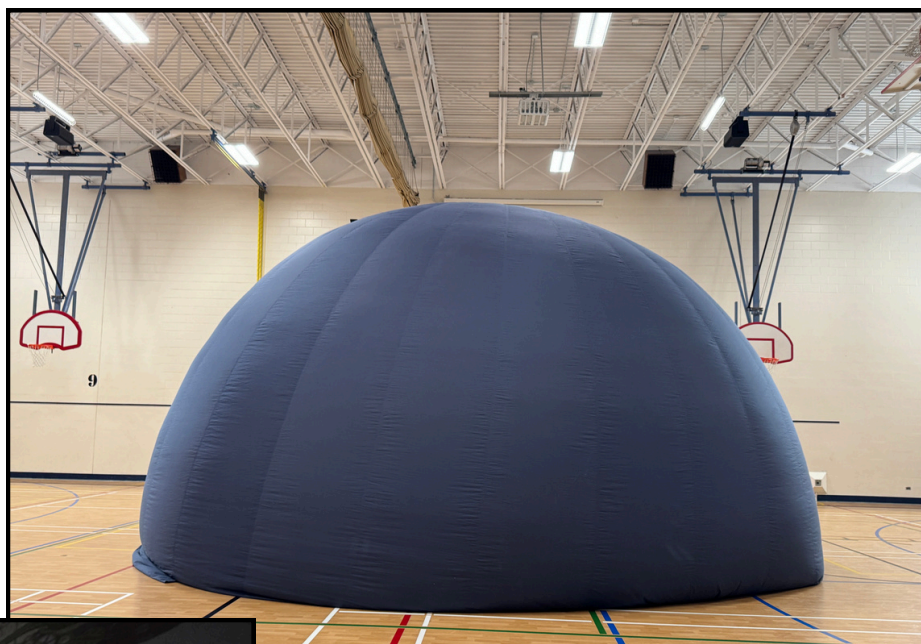

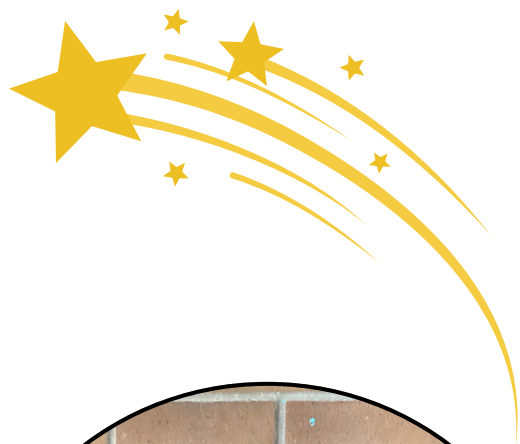
# Interviews with Grade 6s

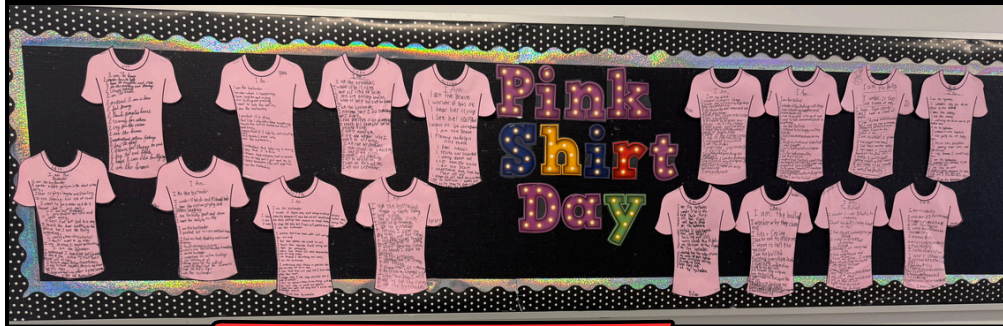
Dwayne, Rm 9

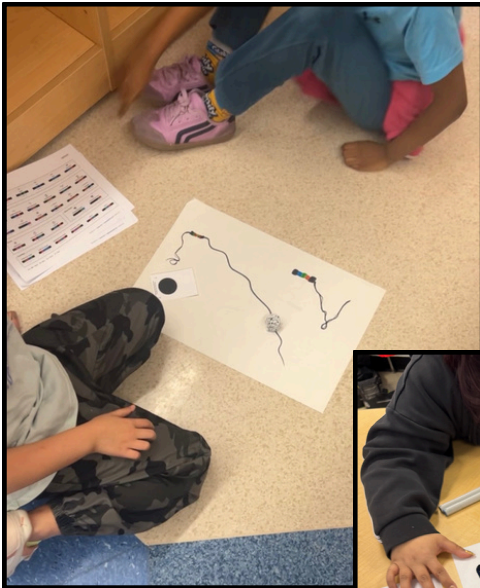

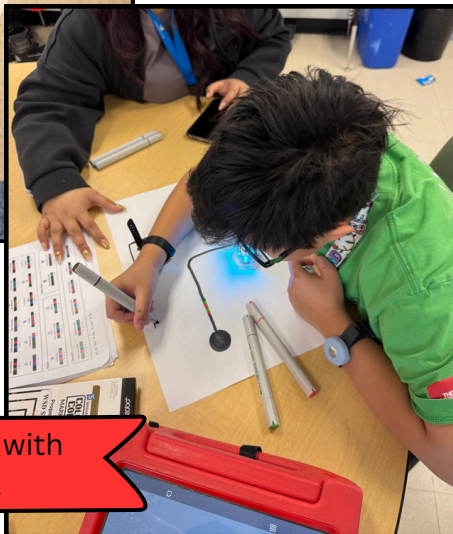
