

## Room 103

**Mme Brown** 

During the month of November, the students took turns presenting for Show and Tell. They were introduced to descriptive French vocabulary and practiced becoming more comfortable speaking in front of their peers.

In recognition of Remembrance Day, our class learned about the importance of the poppy and what it symbolizes. We took time to reflect on the sacrifices made by others to ensure our freedom and peace.









#### Room 105 - Mrs. Galbraith

For Remembrance Day, Nursery Kindergarten students made Peace Poppies out of clay. We learned that when put together properly, 4 hearts make a poppy. They were fired in the kiln to make them beautiful and shiny!





This month we've been focusing on our fine motor skill. One way we've been doing that is by putting beads on pipe cleaners to make beautiful bracelets for our friends and families! Hopefully, you've been lucky enough to receive one already!

#### Room 106 - Mme Aulakh

**French:** We combined vowels with consonants to build syllables and started the building of sentences and started la dictee in french. We keep reading with Mr. Jones' class for "reading buddies."

**Science:** In Social Studies, we talked about Remembrance Day. Also, the location of Manitoba on a Canada map and the provinces near of Manitoba. In Natural Sciences, we discussed outdoor physical education (What are your feelings after doing such an activity? why leaves collected change color?)

**Math:** We continued working with numbers: counting, mentally representing numbers up to 100. We have done the concepts of ones and tens. Also, we have started adding numbers.

**Health:** We discussed the 4 groups of healthy foods and their impact on our body.

**English:** We practiced the spelling of some words. Ability to listen and write what is listened to.

Thank you Max It was wonderful to have everyone visit and celebrate the students' learning this month during our student-led conferences. The students in our class were all very excited to show their work to their families. As you can tell we are right in the middle of our Owl Inquiry and are learning so much about these amazing creatures. This month has been full of autumn activities and discussions on how we prepare for the coming winter. What do we do at home, in the yard, and also with our things? It is a time to put some things away and take out items that we use for winter. We also celebrated the amazing northern lights that we could see from our own neighbourhood this year. Next month will be full of learning about each other and our celebrations.

Take a look at room 206 structures and materials project. The students in Room 206 had to create a bridge that can hold different materials.















#### Room 207 - Mme Arnold

#### Room 208 - Mme. Lianne


The month of November has gone by so fast! Math has been a classroom favourite! We have learnt about different patterns and even got to make our own patterns with beads. We have also learnt about estimation! We have learnt to make a thoughtful guess. Students got to walk around the room and estimate different objects in cups.

In English we have been working hard on "cvc" words (consonant, vowel, consonant) we have used our knowledge of letter sounds to sound out these 3 letter words and find them in books.

We have been learning about the 7 sacred teachings and watching videos from the turtle lodge from elder Nii Gaani Aki Inini. Ask your students how they can show respect, love, courage, honesty, wisdom, humility and truth at home and at school.

#### Room 301 - M. Maciejewski

Hello families of room 301,

November has been a month of learning and practice. Here's what we've done across the subjects: In math, students have discussed place value for up to, and over one million by identifying place value and comparing numbers. In working towards multiplication of decimal numbers, students have reviewed vertical addition and practiced multiplication of 2-digit by 2-digit numbers.

French class has seen students focus on sentence types (declarative, exclamatory, interrogative, and imperative), along with further verb study and writing.

In English, we have continued to read together and do some written response work.

In social studies, students have done research on the first five prime ministers of Canada, and shared presentations on one prime minister from those five of their choice.

In science, students have wrapped up our work on electricity and will be moving on to our next unit of study soon.

That's all, folks! Until next time, take good care.

November has been a little calmer than usual in Room 304. We finally finished our projects in time to show them off to the parents during the student led conferences. Those were a hit this year and the students were very proud to present their work so far. We've also had the pleasure of having a student teacher, Mme Kahina, observe us for a couple of weeks. She will return for a few weeks in April. As far as subjects are concerned, we have started our unit on the weather for science and our unit on geometry in math. Both of these will be great canvases for inquiry projects in the following month or two.

Room 309 - Mme Citieuh

#### French:

This month, students have been busy reading and expanding their vocabulary and understanding of French sounds. We continue to build confidence through regular practice and engaging activities. Mathematics:

In math, we are working on number representation and exploring mental-math strategies such as doubles, doubles plus one, and doubles minus one. Students have enjoyed playing math games that help strengthen these skills while also encouraging communication in French.

#### **Social Studies:**

Our class is learning about Manitoba's historical sites, Francophone communities, and the First Peoples of Manitoba. Students are beginning to recognize important places and groups that shape our province's history.

#### English:

In English, we are focusing on spelling patterns, including words ending in *ough* and those with the *u* sound. Students are practicing writing simple but complete sentences and have started creating short pieces about their personal interests.

#### Room 310 - Mr. Papineau

Hello everybody, October was a busy month, and your students have adapted well to our classroom routines. In math, we worked on daily activities such as problem solving, math drills, and multiplication and division in our more formal lessons. In spelling program, we've made progress with adding -ing suffixes and all students are showing growth. Science saw us learning about the Diversity of Living Things and creating art inspired by Andy Goldsworthy to enhance that learning; the attached photos are from our leaf collection expedition to Fisher Park. Students have been working on their writing and editing skills and are enjoying the second book from the MYRCA nominees list for 2025.

We have been creating and rehearsing with Room 304 our assembly presentation for November 4<sup>th</sup>, the topic being Responsibility. If you did not see the message on Seesaw about this but are learning about it just now then there's still a chance to attend! The kids were very open minded, willing to take risks, and use drama to help assemble this lengthy presentation. It was a lot of work and patience but we all enjoyed the effort and hope that the end result will be amazing!

#### Physical Education - Ms. Kearns

This past month students have been working on the skill of striking. Grades four to six have worked on volleyball skills like the bump, set and spike along with underhand serving. Classes have included practice drills that help develop hand eye coordination along with short sets of TripleBall to understand game play and strategy. Students in the primary years have explored the skill of striking using different equipment such as noodles, our hands, balloons, volleyballs, and gator balls. Classes have included rallying, keeping control of a ball using a strike, and lead up activities. This month, THE FASTEST CLASS CHALLENGE was introduced. This is a whole school challenge, where classes compete to have the highest average of laps run/student during a 5 min span. Room 304 was awarded our first ever FASTEST CLASS title. Bravo 304!






