Money raised will support students' field trips and experiential learning. This fundraiser has been quite successful in past years and we are hoping it will be again this year!


7 flavours are being offered with each bag priced at \$3.00. All orders must be paid in cash only, and no change will be provided.

***Literacy night is a chance to invite families to learn about what the grade 1-2's learn at school, also to see what kind of strategies and games parents can use for teaching at home.***



After the event, I asked a few more questions!

Literacy night was a great and successful event! If your child is grade 1-2 ask them about their 'Map the Sound' activity and you will not be disappointed!






# Interviews with Grade 6s

Max Lauren, Rm 9




