❖ **Literacy**

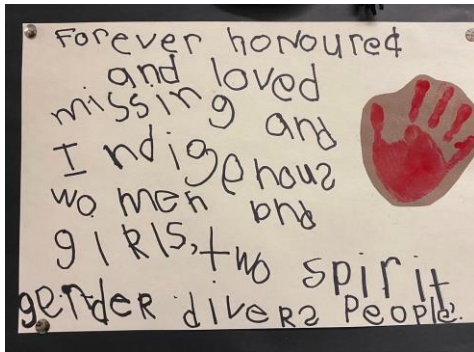
All students and staff will participate in learning experiences that involve the use of student voice and multimodal representation to create meaning and engagement as readers and writers.

❖ Library Nights

Our families were welcomed into our library twice each month to enjoy some food, games, crafts and an opportunity to take out books.

❖ Fort Rouge Co-op Day Nursery - School Age Program

This neighborhood daycare shares 1 of our classrooms for their school-age Before and After program. We work in close contact with the daycare staff to ensure that student's needs are met.

❖ Fort Rouge Child Care

This is another neighborhood daycare that we work closely with. Students attending this daycare are walked to and from school.

❖ Performing Arts Collaborations

Students were able to learn and interact with members of the WCO and then join them on stage for a divisional performance at Tec Voc. We were also able to enjoy a performance from a Korean dance and drumming company and participate in a dance workshop with members of the Royal Winnipeg Ballet.

❖ Partnership

We have partnered with the University of Manitoba and Red River Community College, Project 11, Winnipeg Chamber Orchestra, Royal Winnipeg Ballet, N.E.E.D.S. Centre, St. John's Ambulance, MPI, Swimming Counts, Learn to Skate Program, Special Olympics, and the Inner-City Soccer League.
