Dear Gladstone Families,

The intent is for you to have a better understanding of your child's learning through the conversation with their teacher and that this would help to better understand their report card. I encourage you to join us for these conferences. Report cards only give a small snapshot of student learning, while the conferences you will be able to have with your child's teacher allow for a much richer understanding.

When thinking about conferences and report cards, it may be helpful for you to know that when teachers are planning for student learning, they rely on observations, conversation and the work each child has done. The rich diversity at Gladstone allows for many perspectives and ideas, and classrooms are filled with activities that celebrate this and give students a variety of methods to show their learning. We look forward to sharing some of this with you later this month.


Students can take books out of the library to read at home and return when they are done. We will have activities planned as well as refreshments. We hope to see you there!


