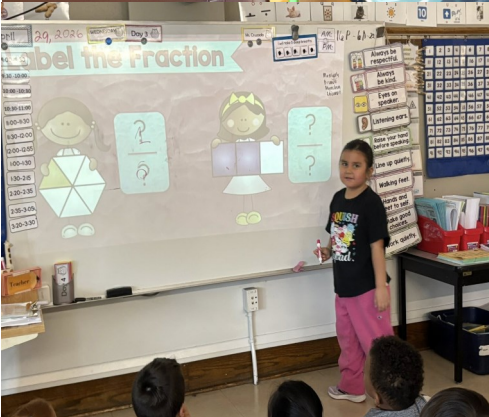
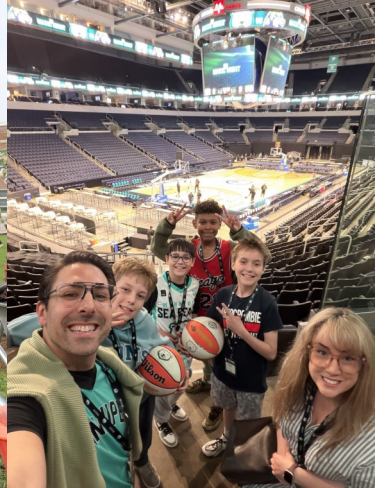

We will continue to explore a variety of math centres that focus on counting, building numbers, patterns, 3-D shapes, as well as practicing some simple addition through hands-on games and the use of math manipulatives. 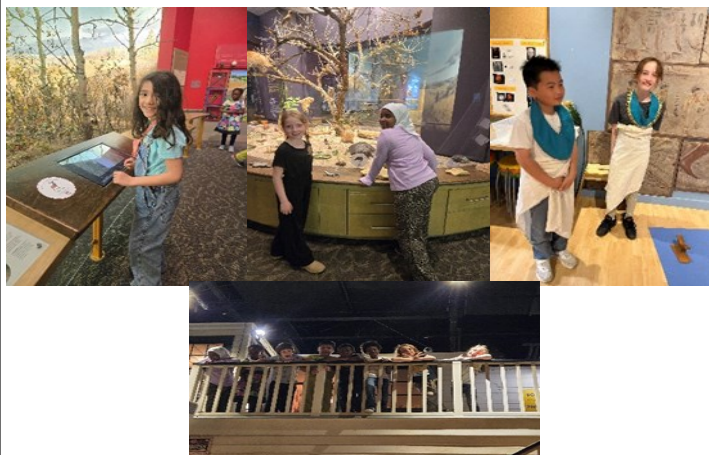
Room 19– Mr. MacDonell:

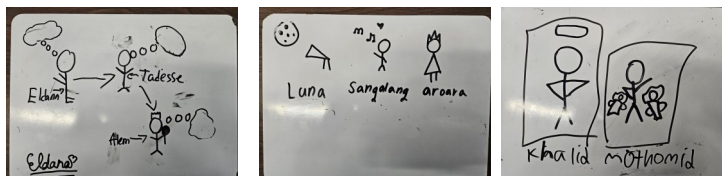

In Math, we finished our unit on comparing numbers, practiced our estimation skills and introduced shapes. We spent the last week of May looking at shapes in our school environment. Looking towards the last few weeks of school, we will be wrapping up math with small units on Money and Measurement. In Science, we have been learning about the butterfly lifecycle! We have our very own painted butterfly caterpillars in Room 1. We spent the month talking about how they grow into big caterpillars before building a chrysalis and finally hatching into butterflies. We look forward to observing their chrysalis stage and pretty soon, we will be releasing new butterflies into the wild! In Social Studies, we are wrapping up our final unit on community by learning about ways we can be community leaders. As a class, we decided to help teach others at our school how to properly recycle. Students have been brainstorming and creating rough-copy poster designs, and in June, they will create their final posters to display around the school to help educate their schoolmates about recycling. In Literacy, we have been reading Charlotte's Web! We had a wonderful time reading our first chapter book! We have been practicing how to make predictions and how to visualize a story without having a picture in front of us. We look forward to finishing our story and finding out how Charlotte saves Wilbur! Thank you for all of your support throughout this school year. We are looking forward to making the most of our final month together and ending Grades 1 and 2 with lots of learning, laughter, and special memories!

Room 21– Mr. Storey: It's almost the end of the school year! As of the day I am writing this, we have 27 school days left before summer vacation starts. That's not a lot of time! In math we have been focusing very strongly on multiplication. The students have been learning different strategies to solve multiplication problems involving 2- and 3-digit numbers. This can be challenging as it's necessary to have a strong grasp of multiplication facts to be successful. For the grade 3's, they have been working on making sure they have the 1x – 5x tables memorized. For grade 4's, they are expected to know their 1x – 5x tables and are focusing on the 6x – 10x tables. If you'd like to see how your child is doing with this, ask them multiplication problems! With writing, we are working on our last nonfiction writing project. Students are writing a how-to guide on a topic of their choice. The learning is focused on step-by-step instruction combined with a compelling introduction paragraph and a congratulatory closing paragraph. These will be on display in June on our bulletin board. With science we are looking at rocks and minerals. Students have learned about the different kinds of rocks that we can see around the world and how they are made up. They are also learning how to classify rocks using five criteria. In social studies we are learning about ancient civilizations. We have learned about the contributions of the Babylonian and Indus Valley empires, and we are currently looking at the Egyptian empire. By the end of the year, students will have learned about the Roman and Greek empires as well. Take a look at the pictures. These are the students' names written using heiroglyphs that they created to represent the meaning of their names. The end of the year is quickly approaching!
