

It has been a joyful and busy month filled with learning and laughter!




Room 208 - Mme Kondziela

Room 301 - M. Maciejewski




Throughout the month of February students have continued spelling work in ELA, begun multiplication with decimal numbers in math, are applying their study of decimal places to measurement (meters, decimeters, centimeters and millimeters), and are working on oral skills through the *Touchstones Discussion Series* in French class. Written work and discussions have served to bolster their understanding of Canada's involvement in the World Wars, and they are completing a cross-curricular project in science that will combine their study of living things with artwork incorporating plants and animals.

Busy doesn't begin to describe the month that we just completed. The month started with finishing up and inviting half the school to try out our mini golf course. Kids and parents alike enjoyed the experience. We also worked toward presenting our speeches for the Concours d'Arts Oratoires. A few of the students will be representing our class during the finals of our school contest on March 6th. Louis Riel has also been a major part of this month, culminating in an assembly dedicated to him. Our class filmed and recited some facts about Louis Riel in front of the entire school. Speaking of filming, we also made some movies of what life would be like in Winnipeg in the very early 1900s. Room 307 has been hard at work this term.

We finished our Kids in the Know unit on personal safety. We learned the seven root safety strategies, common lures, how to stay safe online and much more! The students have become more confident and more capable when it concerns personal safety.

In math we continue to explore numbers and how they can be broken apart and put back together. This includes all basic operations and a special emphasis on multiplication and division. We are now moving into a study of fractions so we can be even more accurate in our measurements and calculations.

We finished our collaborative learning experience about Louis Riel and Metis history and culture. We learned about traditional ways of travel, including canoes, York boats and Red River carts. We also learned about sashes, weaving and the different colours and patterns. The unit was concluded with a "kitchen party" in the gym, complete with live music and dancing!

We've continued to use news stories to improve our reading skills and learn about current events in Canada. Each day we focus on correctly pronouncing the word, rereading familiar text, retelling what each paragraph is about and finding and defining new words in the text. This improves reading accuracy, fluency, comprehension and builds vocabulary.

We look forward to a March filled with learning and hockey playoffs! Go Seals 😊



Room 308 - Mr. Hawash

A lot of learning has taken place! We're enjoying our latest novel study together. Students have shared their thoughtful ideas.

We have worked very hard on Math strategies to build our multiplication and division skills.

We have had a terrific month of conducting experiments. Students were extremely engaged in static and circuit electricity activities. Maybe you heard buzzers and our doorbell if you were near our classroom?

We enjoyed learning about certain sports in the Olympic Games. In keeping active, we had a great day skiing. A community walk was also good for us.

Room 309 - Mme. Citieuh

It has been a busy and exciting time in our classroom! Students have been actively engaged in their learning across all subject areas. Here is a snapshot of what we have been working on:

French:

In French, we are working on French sounds using the *Son au graphe* program, which is the French version of UFLI. Students are strengthening their decoding and spelling skills by making connections between sounds and letter patterns. We are also preparing for our **Concours d'art oratoire**, where students are developing their public speaking skills. In addition, we have begun using verbs more consciously in our writing to improve sentence structure and clarity.

Math:

Students are exploring patterns. They are learning to create and describe increasing and decreasing patterns by identifying the starting point and clearly stating the rule that explains how the pattern continues.

Science:

In Science, students designed and built bridges. They tested their bridges to evaluate their strength and learned about stability and structure through hands-on experimentation.

Social Studies:

Students are beginning to learn about Active Democratic Citizenship. They are exploring the rights and responsibilities of Canadian citizens and discussing what it means to be an active and responsible member of our community.

Health:

Students will soon begin learning about building personal safety skills through the *Kids in the Know* program.

Room 310 - Mr. Papineau

February was another busy month for everyone in Room 310:



- I Love to Read Month, and Black History Month lessons were included in our learning, which involved sharing the book Beatrice and Croc Harry, written by Canadian author Lawrence Hill.
- In Math we continue to use problem solving with kenkens, word problems, and 'skyscrapers,' crushed multiplication drills and subtraction - with borrowing - to solidify basic arithmetic skills, and started connecting fractions and decimals.
- In Language Arts we continued with small-group novel studies, spelling, parts of speech, and paragraph writing.
- For Social Studies students learned about the first inhabitants of Canada, their traditional ways of life (and how geographic regions affected them), early colonization, and treaties.
- In Science we worked on Forces, Motion, and Simple Machines, and got the ball (and lever, gear, inclined plane, pulley, screw, and wedge) rolling on our Simple Machines Arcade!
- Grade 6s visited Churchill where they checked out a whole bunch of classroom and activity spaces, and even dissected a very large grasshopper (see pics!).


...and we did all this while being distracted by the Winter Olympics, which of course had to happen during the school day. We will do our best to ensure we won't be distracted like that again...until 2030.





We have also been having thoughtful discussions about land acknowledgements through read-alouds and turn-and-talks. Our next step is creating our own land acknowledgement.




I Love To Read



Our Grade 1–6 students have continued exploring and learning about instrument families. They have been developing both aural and visual recognition skills, as well as gaining an understanding of how different instruments produce sound. A strong foundation in instrument knowledge will support students in class discussions as we prepare for our much-anticipated annual song tournament, which begins in April.

Students in Grades 3–6 have also continued learning how to read and follow a choral score. This has been both a fun and challenging process, as there are many musical terms and markings to navigate. Students are becoming increasingly comfortable interpreting these markings and are learning to identify the notes of the treble clef.

We have also enjoyed preparing our March assembly song, *Try Everything*, featured in the 2016 film *Zootopia*. The song connects perfectly with our assembly theme of courage.





GIVING PROJECTS TABS FOR WHEELCHAIRS

This year our school is partnering with over 190 schools, 310 companies and hundreds of individuals to collect drink can tabs. Once collected, these tabs will be sold to Western Scrap Metal and the money collected will go towards the purchase of a specialized wheel chair for a wonderful child in Manitoba.

This year's recipient is Delainey. She is 13 years old and in grade 6 at Stonybrook Middle School in Steinbach. She is the oldest sibling to two younger sisters and a younger brother. She was diagnosed at three weeks old with a very rare chromosome disorder known as Trisomy 13 or Patau syndrome. 90% of children born with this genetic disorder pass away before their 1st birthday. Delainey was born with multiple holes in her heart, one blind eye, a cleft lip and palate, scoliosis and chronic cystic kidney disease. She is non-mobile and nonverbal, but is an extremely expressive young lady. Despite the negative prognosis, Delainey is a medical miracle as she continues to beat all the odds stacked against her and lives her best life. She is a very happy and affectionate girl and brings lots of joy and laughter to the lives of those she meets! Delainey loves to greet everyone with a "hello" and "high fives"! She loves school, especially phys ed, bus rides, her EA's, and is very much loved by her peers! Other favorites of hers are car rides, music, and she is a major foodie!!!




Thank you to all of the teachers, admin and staff who ensured the students arrived in an orderly fashion and made it back safe to the school afterwards .



- Location: Riverview CC meeting room




