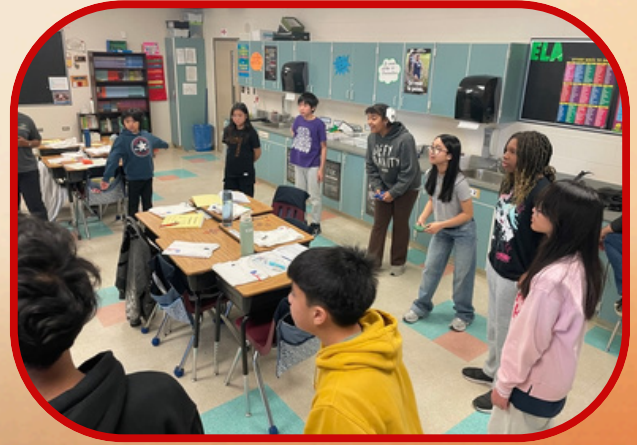

Please note that the school is closed on the 18th as it is Victoria day.



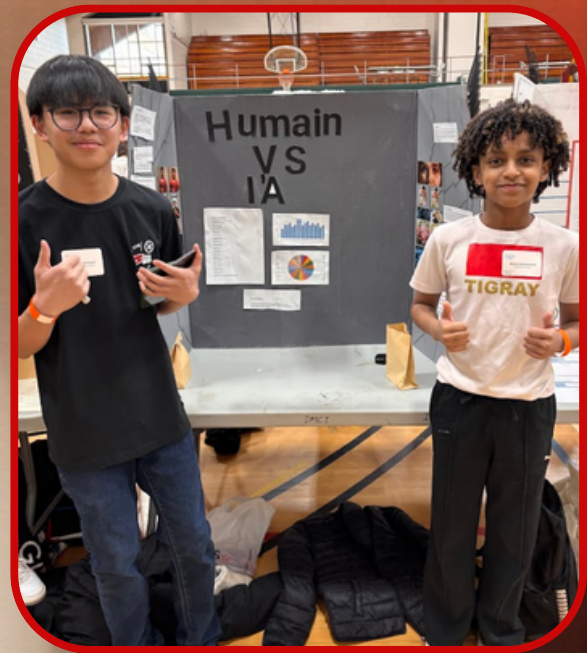
APRIL CLASSROOM LEARNING AND FUN

Students have spent months on project-based learning. The grade 4-8 students completed Concours d'art oratoire and Heritage Fair projects while some of them also polished up their Invent an Alien projects. Congratulations to Althea in grade 8 who went on to represent our division at the provincial contest ! Well done!

Ten students represented the school at the 40th annual Invent an Alien event held at the University of Manitoba. The results are in! Bronze for Eliana and Ayumi for their alien Blosh and Ellison for his alien Minar. Silver for Lam and Claire with their alien Gélibara, Khaleesi and Winnie with their alien Sabre Flamme, and Gleaness and Jadalyn with their alien Zyglor. 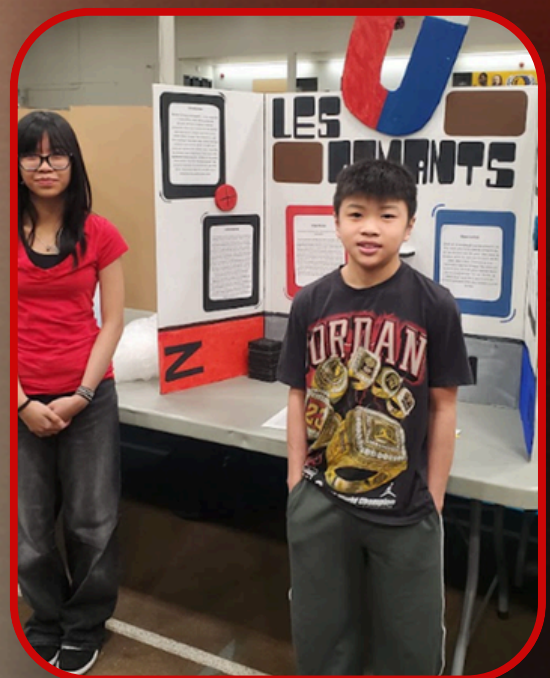
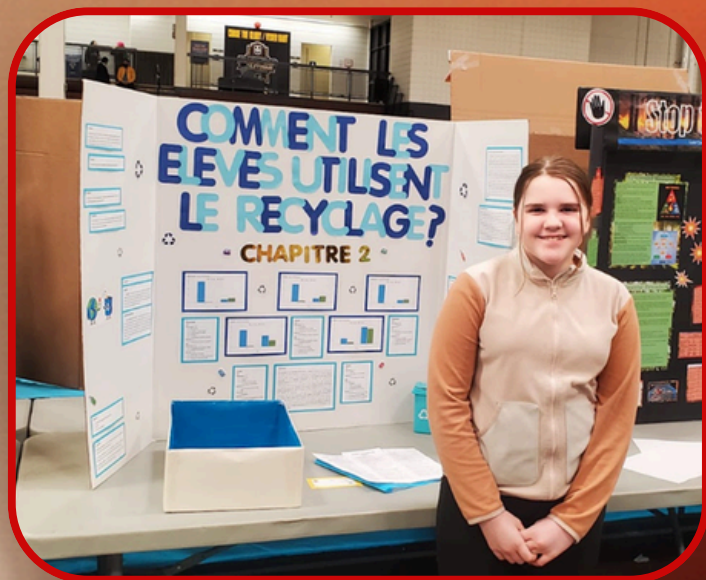


The school also had students attend the divisional Winnipeg Schools' Science Fair held on April 7th at Tec Voc High School and the Manitoba Schools' Science Symposium from April 10th to 12th at the University of Manitoba.

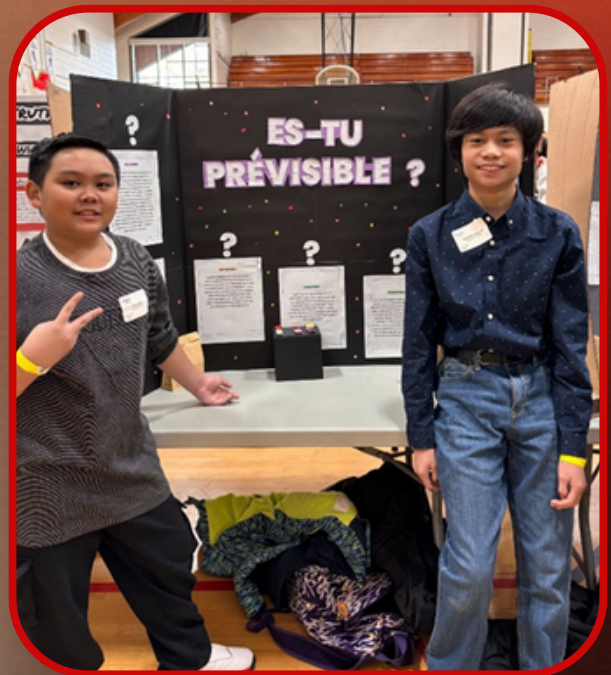
For both science fairs, students developed projects on a wide variety of topics and then had to explain them in French to judges. Feedback from the students was positive and we hope that they will continue to be curious and question the world around them. The results were as follows:

Winnipeg Schools' Divisional Science Fair:

- **Ella and Rowan received a Gold** as well as the Seed, Plants and Agriculture Innovator Award for their project "Est-Ce Que Les Graines Se Souviennent D'Où Ils Viennent?". They tested if plant seeds "remember" the temperature from the place they originally came from.
- **Rahb and Yanni received a Gold** with their project "Es-tu previsible?" They wanted to determine whether people's behaviour is predictable and whether people follow patterns without realizing it.

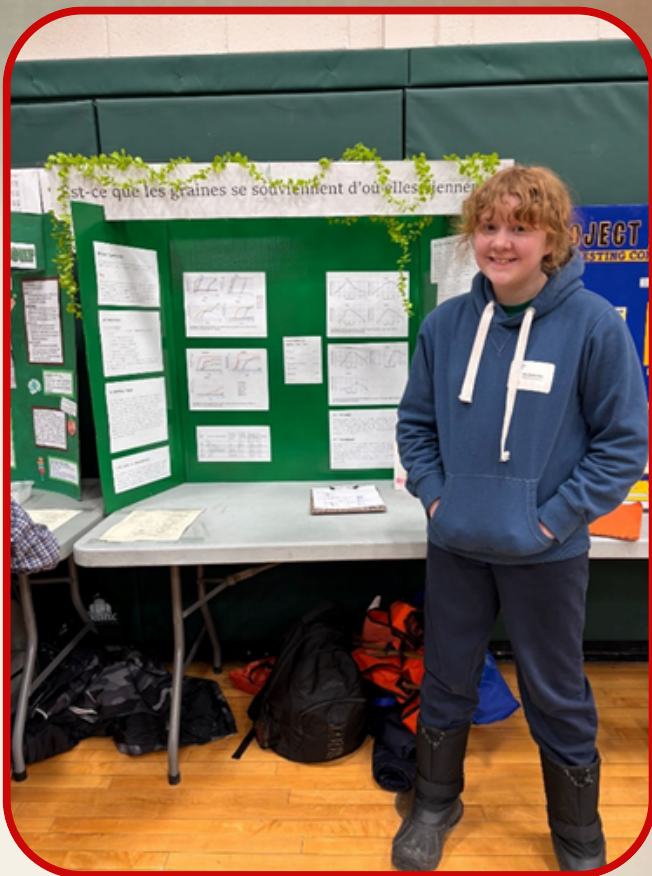


- **Joanna received a Silver medal** for her project “Roche, Papier, Ciseaux”. The project looked at whether people would believe her if she told them exactly what she was going to choose in the game Rock–Paper–Scissors. Will others think she’s telling the truth or will they assume she’s trying to fool them?
- **Maya and Annabelle received a Bronze** with their project “Est-Ce Que La Couleur Affecte La Mémoire?” They were determining whether people will retain more information based on whether the information is presented in colour or in black and white.
- **Natna and Edrei received a Bronze** with their project “Humain Vs. I.A.”. They were Determining whether people can tell the difference between something created by a human and something created by artificial intelligence (AI)
- **Drei and Qwynn received a Bronze** for “L'Eau Filtree” which tested natural water filtration systems



At the Manitoba School's Science Symposium, the school had six Grade 7-8 projects in the competition:

- **Emilie received a Gold** for her project "How Students Use Recycling"
- **An and Akisha won a Silver** for their project "Glow Sticks"
- **Ella and Rowan won Silver** for their project "Do Seeds Remember Their Origins?"
- **Trina and Able** received a bronze for their project "Magnets"
- **Kaylee and Julia** won a Bronze for their project "To Weigh or to Measure? Finding the Best Way to Bake Cookies"
- **Brendan and Genevieve won a Bronze and a special award in the Junior Category from Engineers Geoscientists Manitoba** for their project, "How can a building survive an earthquake?"





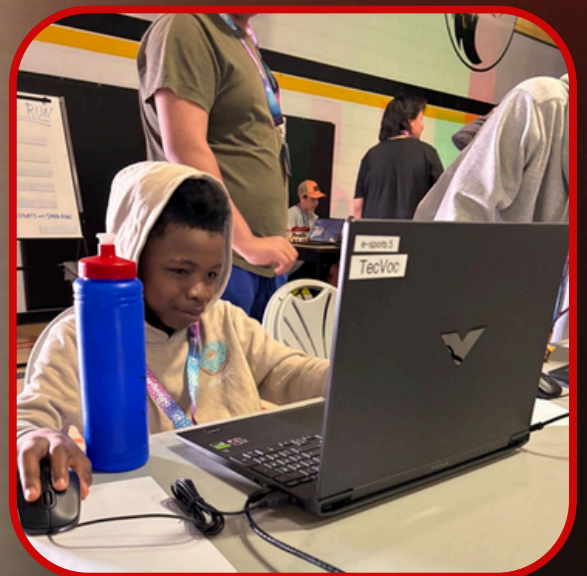
Winnipeg School Division
