Welcome back from Winter Break! The Parent-Teacher Conferences in December saw record attendance while the Winter Concert performances had lower attendance than usual due to weather conditions. Thank you for supporting and being a partner in your child's learning. Spirit Week fun was had by everyone in the building and was a great end to 2025!

January is the beginning of a new year and nature's way of saying, 'Let's begin again'". Calendar years are tracked through three main types of calendars: solar which follows the earth's rotation around the sun; lunar which focuses on months that follow phases of the moon; and lunisolar which is a combination of the two methods. There also are many variations within each type of calendar.

The Anishinaabe calendar follows the moon cycles. There are Thirteen Moons within the year and each moon reflects changes in the environment. Traditional teachings and guidance on how to establish mino bamaadaziwin or mino-pimatisiwin (the good life) are associated to each of the moon's phases. The names differ by region and often among different communities. The first moon is January, Spirit Moon (Manidoo Giizis), and a time when we are encouraged to sit in silence and reflection. Cold winter days are perfect opportunities for reflection!

In January, we begin again and reflect on our learning journey along the way.

This month students have the opportunity to review our PBIS common area expectations, safety drills, be a part of community through clubs/sports and at the Family Night. Gr 5/6 students will attend Winter Camp! Though the days of January are sure to be cold, there is a lot to look forward to!


Where is the violation happening?

School roadway congestion

- Reporting roadway congestion around a school during the morning or afternoon drop off and pick up times due to parked cars around the school
- Traffic violations such as making illegal turns, not observing traffic controls or other, contact Winnipeg Police Non-Emergency at English: 204-986-6222 or French: 204-986-7705

In following the rules of the road, as well as safe pick up and drop off practices, parents picking up children in their vehicles should park on the correct side of the street and walk across Lansdowne Ave to greet their child rather than allowing them to run across the road. Parking on the correct side of Lansdowne allows for traffic to flow properly from Parr St. driving towards McKenzie St.

There are also many other places to park on the east side of Lansdowne, Inkster and Parr.


Book Swap


