## Message from École La Vérendrye Parent Council (PAC)



What is PAC? It is your opportunity to discuss matters that impact our school community. PAC discussions are an important first step to shaping what WSD provides or approves for our school.

Parents across WSD have a say at their respective PACs. PAC representatives from WSD schools then meet to share information, priorities, and concerns. Having broad input from the École LaVérendrye parent community is important!

Commitment? École LaV's PAC meets once per month for one hour.

What is on your mind? Some of what other parents in the WSD South District PAC are discussing include:

### **Staffing**

The lunch program, i.e. WSD providing supervision for lunchtimes remains an issue for schools in WSD South District.

Staffing is also an issue for schools who, like LaV do not have a full complement of teachers and often find that there are no substitutes available for coverage when staff are away.PAC is one of the means to ask what WSD is doing to recruit and retain teachers and what they are doing to assist schools in the meantime.

### **Childcare**

There never seems to be enough spots available.

The Board of Trustees for Winnipeg School Division ("WSD") has issued a "WSD PAC Feedback Tool: Childcare, Nursery, and Kindergarten' asking PACs to facilitate discussion with parents on childcare to consider possible expansions to early childhood programs and services. Feedback from discussion at PAC is to be used in creating WSD's 2026/2027 budget.

### **Fundraising**

WSD's policies around fundraising changed last year, and PAC's are struggling to work within the framework they have now been given. It has a big impact on what the community can contribute directly to our school.

Of course, fundraising always needs volunteers. LaV's PAC is currently looking for someone to head the Fundraising Committee.

Next scheduled meeting of LaV PAC is on Monday, November 17, 2025 at 7:00 p.m.

Don't be shy. We will see you there!





#### **Unplugged Initiative**

On a motion brought forward by a parent, LaV PAC is encouraging families to sign the Unplugged Canada pledge, which says you commit to delaying smartphone access for your child until they are at least 14 years old. You can still provide a basic phone for calls and texts while adhering to the pledge, and tablet or computer use is also fine.

An Ipsos poll from September 2025 found that 84% of Canadians say kids should be at least 16 to join social media, and 4 in 5 Gen Zs state that they have lived through the harms and support delaying social media until 16.
