#### Room 105 - Mrs. Galbraith

In October, students learned about patterns in movements, words, colours and shapes. We explored simple repeating patterns (Ex: AB, ABB, ABC) to build thinking and problem-solving skills and had fun making up our own patterns for our friends to copy.

We read many books about Thanksgiving, and we explored what it means to be thankful by coming up with a list of things that were important to us. We learned that many people have a tradition of serving turkey at Thanksgiving dinner, and we created pinecone turkeys with patterns on their tails to decorate our Thanksgiving dinner tables.

#### Room 106 - Mme Aulakh

October has been a fun and busy month in Grade 1! Students are exploring the five senses using pumpkins—we are touching, smelling, looking, and even listening as we learn how our senses help us discover the world around us. We also reflected on **Truth and Reconciliation Day** by making a class pledge to be kind and remember that every child matters.

#### **Room 201 – M. Max**

**French:** We combined vowels with consonants to build syllables. Then, we practiced reading in groups and independently. We established a connection with Mr. Jones' class for "reading buddies."

**Science:** In Social Studies, we talked about Indigenous peoples and completed a visual art activity for Orange Shirt Day. In Natural Sciences, we explored position and movement. We worked on French vocabulary for different positions of an object.

**Math:** We continued working with numbers: counting, mentally representing numbers up to 100, skip counting by 2s, 5s, and 10s, identifying even and odd numbers, and exploring patterns.

**Health:** We discussed the importance of having a clean environment.

**English:** We practiced the pronunciation of the letter "a" and its different sounds in words depending on the presence or absence of a final vowel "e."

#### Room 204 - Mrs. Warren

October in room 204

We have been watching the changing seasons this month and noticing the different weather. We keep track of the weather with a graph each school day. It is amazing how often it changes even within a day. We spent time exploring our feelings and what we are thankful for this month and are now thinking about the coming Halloween fun. We have used pattern blocks to make Halloween shapes, counted skeleton bones in art, created jack-o-lanterns and flying witches to go with our read aloud books. We are learning about the characters in stories and using describing words to make sentences about them. We have been looking for action words in sentences as well.

In math we have been skip counting by 2's and 5's, as well as practicing addition and subtraction skills. We are beginning a science inquiry to learn about owls.

#### Room 207 - Mme Arnold

Room 207 has been busy learning all about spiders! Students explored a spider's life cycle, habitat, and how spiders differ from insects. In math, they've been practicing addition and subtraction, strengthening their counting skills and number sense with two-digit numbers. In French, students are learning vowel sounds and the difference between "au" and "eau." This month, students also learned about gratitude and created a beautiful Thankful Tree to share what they are most thankful for.

#### Room 208 - Mme Kondziela

The month of October has been very exciting here in grade 1. We are wrapping up learning the sounds of all the letters of the alphabet and are excited to move into some phonics. We have had a few exciting lessons while learning about the 5 senses which have included trying different drinks, trying to guess the sound, playing with glow sticks and smelling scratch and sniff stickers. #### Room 209 - Mrs. Dorman

The past month in Room 209 we have focused on Math groups, Reading groups, Writing workshop and Social Studies.

In math and reading groups, small student groups work together on similar tasks, such as subtracting large numbers or multiplication in math and reading to show understanding in print. Writing has focused on the process of rough drafting, revising and final copies. Our social studies unit is all about Canada! It's geography, regions and symbols.

In November we will be starting our Science unit on Habitats – should be fun!

#### Room 301 – M. Maciejewski

October was busy in room 301; here's what the students have been up to. In mathematics, they've been focusing on problem solving, especially where word problems require multiple steps and provide different degrees of information. In this context, they've applied knowledge related to integers and interpreting graphs and data. In ELA students have begun their first novel study, where we'll be reading Fortunately, the Milk by Neil Gaiman as a class. In French, students have continued verb study and worked on reading comprehension through news-article studies and discussions. In science, students have gotten to further explore electricity as we near the end of our unit. We've discussed circuits (series and parallel), and students have gotten to demonstrate their understanding with Snap Circuits. In Social Studies, we have discussed events related to the confederation of Canada and will proceed by discussing Canadian government leaders and indigenous leaders in the time after confederation. Finally, we are working on some ambitious art pieces to unveil before Halloween that draw inspiration from Italian Renaissance art.

#### Room 304 - M. Asselin

Hello from room 304! We have been working fiercely to finish our two major projects while, at the same time, getting ready with room 310 for the next assembly which will happen on November 4th. We haven't had a chance to be bored yet, but all of this will be completed in a couple of weeks, and we are looking forward to a little down time afterwards. The children have had a blast doing these projects and can't wait to show them to their parents during the meetings in November. The assembly will also be a whole lot of "Family" fun if everything works as it should, and all of the people are there. Feel free to show up that morning and see the kids in action.

Science saw us learning about the Diversity of Living Things and creating art inspired by Andy Goldsworthy to enhance that learning; the attached photos are from our leaf collection expedition to Fisher Park. Students have been working on their writing and editing skills and are enjoying the second book from the MYRCA nominees list for 2025.

We have been creating and rehearsing with Room 304 our assembly presentation for November 4th, the topic being Responsibility. If you did not see the message on Seesaw about this but are learning about it just now, then there's still a chance to attend! The kids were very open minded, willing to take risks, and use drama to help assemble this lengthy presentation. It was a lot of work and patience, but we all enjoyed the effort and hope that the end result will be amazing!

We have also begun preparing our Remembrance Day songs "Candle for Peace" and "Hymn to Freedom." Our grades 5 & 6 extra-curricular choir will also be presenting a special selection at this service which will take place on November 10th at 10:00 a.m.

A wonderful group of 90 grades 3-6 students have completed our preliminary eight session term and are now doing auditions for casting of our May production of "Seussical the Musical." It is exciting to see the awesome preparation the children are putting into their auditions and inspiring to see the courage the kids are exhibiting at their auditions.

#### Physical Education – Ms. Kearns

The gym has been a busy place this past month! Students have explored the sport of soccer and the main three skills of passing, shooting and dribbling. Primary classes played various lead up games to practice the skill of kicking. Grades 3-6 were introduced to game scenarios and discussed invasion game strategies like a give and go, marking a player and creating space on the field. Grade 5 + 6 students were invited to join a soccer club and play in a mini tournament at River Heights School. They played hard, were great sports and represented our school well! We ended the month with a review of throwing and catching using different objects like gator balls, scoops, and soft footballs. November will lead us into volleyball and triple ball season for grades 5 and 6. Primary grades will continue to develop their striking skills during lead-up net and wall games.



### Truth and Reconciliation in Our Learning Spaces




