September was a busy month. We started off the school year with our fourth annual Meet the Staff BBQ, which was a wonderful and relaxed event where we got to connect with familiar and new families. It was wonderful having families and students in the building during this time, and we feel as though

We had our first assembly on September 5th, where we reviewed school and recess expectations. The 8th was the first day of school for our Nursery and Kindergarten students, and the entire school gave them a warm welcome. Students were encouraged to wear their orange shirts as a way to commemorate and honor Truth and Reconciliation and

to proclaim that Every Child Matters.

I want to give a huge thank you to all staff who participated in

the planning and execution of these various events.



Picture day is scheduled for Tuesday, October 14th, 2025 and will take place in the gymnasium. This is an all-day event!


LifeTouch will once again be taking classroom photos this year.

OCTOBER IS I LOVE TO READ MONTH

To encourage reading a variety of genres, texts and styles, students are invited to play BINGO as part of their Home Reading for the month of October. Bingo cards will be sent home on October 1st. Please return the cards to school by the end of the month to show your teacher your reading accomplishment.

Tuesday October 7 will be Pyjama, Stuffy and Book Day. Students get to wear their pyjamas to school plus may bring a stuffy and book along with them for the day.

Stop, Drop and Read: A few times this month there will be an announcement for students to stop everything and read for 10 - 15 minutes.

Mystery Reader: A few times this month there will be an announcement from our Mystery Reader. They will read a short portion of a story to the entire school. Students get to tell their guesses to the classroom teacher. The Mystery Reader will make a second announcement revealing their identity.

Teacher Swap: Teachers will partner up, choose a date & time and switch classrooms to read a 15–30-minute story. We suggest teachers swap with whoever they are already partnered up with for Reading Buddies. This is a great opportunity for students to get to know other teachers they will be regularly grouped with throughout the year.

- 1. It is part of our sustainability and environmental awareness campaign to reduce waste generated in student lunches. By choosing to reuse packaging and ditching single-use items, we can keep unnecessary garbage out of the landfill.
- 2. The funds raised are put towards "greening" the school and environmental education events such as field trips or bringing in guest speakers.

Depending on the item(s) ordered, the school will earn \$4.50-\$13.50 per item.

Student Absence Reporting System

What is Safe Arrival?

Safe Arrival is an absence management system that improves student safety and makes it easy for you to let the school know about your child's absence.

School Messenger / Safe Arrival App (Free)

- 1. Provide your email address to the school.
- 2. Get the app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store.
- 3. Tap Sign Up to create your account.
- 4. Select Attendance from the menu, and then select Report and Absence.

Web and Mobile Web option: go.schoolmessenger.com

- I. Provide your email address to the school.
- 2. Go to the website.
- 3. Click Sign Up to create your account.
- 4. Select Attendance from the menu, then select Report and Absence.

The school does attendance twice a day - at 8:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m.

If your child(ren) is/are marked absent from their class and and absence was not added onto the Safe Arrival system, you will receive an email and an automated call from the system.
