

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Solar Eclipse School Plan

As you are likely aware, there is a Partial Solar Eclipse occurring in Winnipeg on Monday, April 8th beginning approximately at noon and ending around 3:00 p.m. Information from Public Heath was shared in our Week At A Glance prior to spring break.

As per Public Health, the Winnipeg School Division/our School will be following the recommendation to keep students and staff inside during the above times. To celebrate this unique event, we encourage all students and staff to wear an eclipse outfit on Monday (anything individual's feel represent an eclipse).

Just like during inclement weather, we will have indoor activities during lunch and last recess instead of going outside. Students who go home for lunch are welcome to bring a lunch to stay at school on Monday. Please communicate your lunch plan with your child's teacher. Patrols will only be on duty at the start of the lunch hour. If your child will go home for lunch, please arrange a safe plan for their return at the end of the lunch hour.

During the morning, teachers will be doing some learning with students about the eclipse and then taking time to view it online in their class-rooms in the afternoon. No one will be going outside to view it, even if they have sunglasses.

A total solar eclipse will take place on Monday, April 8th between noon and 3:00 pm.

While this event is an incredible celestial experience, there are some risks to one's vision if precautions are not taken.

WSD takes advice from Public Health and proceeds accordingly. Please see the attached PDF.

What are the hazards of viewing a solar eclipse?

Looking at the sun, including during a solar eclipse, can cause solar retinopathy, which can permanently damage the retina's light-sensitive cells at the back of the eye. Even a brief look at the sun during an eclipse can cause permanent harm to the eyes. A person may not experience any pain or discomfort while watching the event and still suffer severe damage as a result.

Symptoms may not surface until 12 to 48 hours after the event and could involve retinal burns, temporary or permanent vision loss and blurred vision. Once symptoms start, it is usually too late to reverse any resulting damage. If someone experiences any changes in their vision from watching the solar eclipse, they should immediately have someone else drive them to a hospital or to their optometrist to be assessed.

Additional resources are available through the Royal Astronomical Society of Canada, the American Astronomical Society and the Canadian Association of Optometrists.

What is a solar eclipse?

During a solar eclipse, the moon moves between the sun and the Earth, partially or completely blocking the sun's rays. This means that the sun will appear less bright, and people will be able to look at it directly without turning away.

Schools and child care facilities are encouraged to have a basic plan to ensure that children, students and staff will be safe.

Keep a close eye on children during a solar eclipse. Their eyes are still developing and let in more light to the retina than adult eyes, so they are at higher risk of harm if they look at the sun without proper eye protection.

How can I safely observe a solar eclipse?

Indirect observation through a recording (for example, watching on television or streaming online) is the safest way to view an eclipse. Direct observation requires appropriate safety measures, including internationally-certified eclipse glasses. Sunglasses, camera lenses (including smart phone cameras), binoculars, telescopes or anything else that is not specifically made for viewing an eclipse are not safe.

RE: Solar Eclipse - Monday, April 8, 2024

A total solar eclipse is set to occur on April 8, 2024, between approximately noon and 3 p.m. Central Standard Time, spanning from Southern Ontario to Newfoundland and Labrador, with the rest of Canada experiencing a partial eclipse. Manitoba will experience an approximate 50 percent occlusion eclipse.

This is an awe-inspiring event that will draw the gaze of people; however, there is a risk of permanent vision damage if proper precautions are not taken. Even a brief look at the partially eclipsed sun can result in permanent damage.

Children and students may need extra supervision during the eclipse, as they may not fully comprehend the risks involved. Early learning and child care facilities and schools are encouraged to have plans in place to keep children indoors during the afternoon to ensure they don't view the eclipse unless appropriate eye protection is available and worn. Note that anyone who may not understand the risk or have difficulty following safety instructions are at greater risk.

Manitoba Education and Early Childhood Learning has consulted and collaborated with Manitoba Health, Seniors and Long-Term Care, to develop the attached guidance on solar eclipses. This resource includes a general overview, risks, and information on how to view eclipses safely.

Manitoba Education and Early Childhood Learning will continue to work in collaboration with its partners to ensure the health and safety of children, students, and staff. Thank you for your continued interest, engagement, and collaboration as we work together to create positive and thriving learning environments.
