Nursery & Kindergarten Registrations for September 2024-2025

We are now accepting registrations for all grades for September 2024-2025!

If you are a resident of the Winnipeg School Division:

***NURSERY/KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM (No Fee):** There are several forms that you will need to fill out as well as various documents you will need to provide (Please see checklist on our school website) (Children born in 2020/2019)

***GRADE 1-GRADE 6 (No Fee):** Same as above

If you are NOT a resident of the Winnipeg School Division:

***NURSERY PROGRAM (FEE):** You will be required to fill out several forms and provide documentation as well as pay the fee of \$5700.00 (subject to change) for the school year

***KINDERGARTEN-GRADE 6 (No Fee):** You will need to fill out the forms and provide the documentation as well as fill out a Non-Resident Form

ALL REGISTRATIONS ARE BASED ON APPROVAL BY PRINCIPAL

If your child attends Tyndall Park School:

***NURSERY-GRADE 5:** Students will be automatically preregistered for next year at the same school

If your child will be changing schools:

Please inform the office immediately if you are planning on changing schools. You will need to fill out registration forms at the forwarding school. Students in Grade 6 will have received forms from Stanley Knowles School in February.

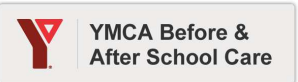

Dear Parents/Guardians:

The Tyndall Park Lunch Program would love to have your child/ren join us here for lunch for the school year 2024-2025. In order to better prepare ourselves, the lunch program is asking **all families with a remaining balance still owing for the current school year to have all fees paid in full by Thursday, April 18, 2024**. We need to know where we sit financially so we can move forward with staffing and scheduling.

We have two **early registration dates** for you to attend in person.

The first date is: **Tuesday, April 23, 2024 3:30 to 6:30 p.m.**

The second date is: **Thursday, May 23, 2024 5:00 to 8:00 p.m.**

It brings me pleasure to announce that the Lunch Program fee for 2024-2025 school year will remain the same for the students of Tyndall Park Community School.

Student enrollment into the Lunch Program for 2024-2025 will only be accepted after registration is completed and paid in full.

Payment options are:

- 1) **E-transfer** or **cash**, one payment made for full amount of **\$260**, or
- 2) by **cheque**, with one cheque written for full amount of **\$260** or 10 individual cheques in the amount of **\$26**, post-dated for the first of each month.

Cheques should be made payable to Tyndall Park Lunch Program. E-transfers will not be accepted for the monthly payment option.

Families will have until **Friday, June 14, 2024** to register your child/ren for the next school year. After June 14th, anyone registering for the Lunch Program will be charged a **\$25.00 late fee**.

CHOIR TAKES HOME A MEDAL

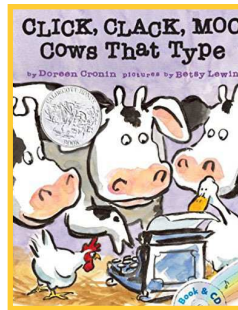

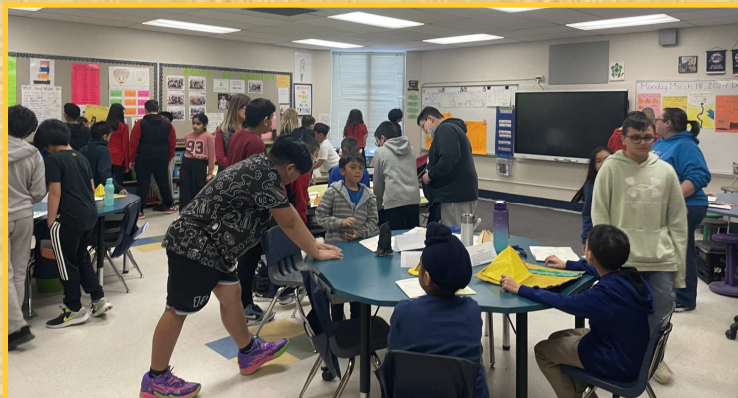

SOLAR ECLIPSE

Safety Measures and Viewing Guidance



What are the hazards of viewing a solar eclipse?

Looking at the sun, including during a solar eclipse, can cause **solar retinopathy**, which can permanently damage the retina's light-sensitive cells at the back of the eye. Even a brief look at the sun during an eclipse can cause **permanent harm** to the eyes. A person may not experience any pain or discomfort while watching the event and still suffer **severe damage** as a result.

Symptoms may not surface until 12 to 48 hours after the event and could involve retinal burns, temporary or permanent vision loss and blurred vision. Once symptoms start, it is usually too late to reverse any resulting damage. If someone experiences any changes in their vision from watching the solar eclipse, they should immediately have someone else drive them to a hospital or to their optometrist to be assessed.

What is a solar eclipse?

During a solar eclipse, the moon moves between the sun and the Earth, partially or completely blocking the sun's rays. This means that the sun will appear less bright, and people will be able to look at it directly without turning away.



Schools and child care facilities are encouraged to have a basic plan to ensure that children, students and staff will be safe.

Keep a close eye on children during a solar eclipse. Their eyes are still developing and let in more light to the retina than adult eyes, so they are at higher risk of harm if they look at the sun without proper eye protection.

How can I safely observe a solar eclipse?

Indirect observation through a recording (for example, watching on television or streaming online) is the safest way to view an eclipse. **Direct observation** requires appropriate safety measures, including internationally-certified eclipse glasses. Sunglasses, camera lenses (including smart phone cameras), binoculars, telescopes or anything else that is not specifically made for viewing an eclipse are not safe.
