## **New Business**

• By-Law No. 1180, a by-law of The Winnipeg School Division for the purpose of permitting religious instruction at John M. King School, was read a third time in short and passed.

## Superintendent's Report No. 1-2011

- In accordance with Policy AGAB Recognition for Special Accomplishment, authority was given for:
- Twelve students from École secondaire Kelvin High School to receive funding in the amount of \$4,800 to support their attendance in the Human Rights and Holocaust Studies Program to be held in Washington, D.C. from May 1-4, 2011. Substitute costs for two teachers of École Secondaire Kelvin High for up to two days each (total 4 days) was approved.
- Approximately 52 students from R.B. Russell High School, Gordon Bell High School, Children of the Earth High School, General Wolfe School and Hugh John Macdonald School to receive funding in the amount of \$20,000 to support their attendance in the Human Rights and Holocaust Studies Program to be held in Washington, D.C. from May 1-4, 2011. Substitute

costs for up seven teachers for up to two days each (total 14 days) was approved.

- Twenty students from Cecil Rhodes School will receive funding in the amount of \$7,500 to support their attendance in the Human Rights and Holocaust Studies Program to be held in Washington, D.C. from May 1-4, 2011. Substitute costs for four teachers of Cecil Rhodes School for up to two days each (total 8 days) was approved.
- Ten students from Tec Voc High School will receive funding in the amount of \$4,000 to support their attendance in the Human Rights and Holocaust Studies Program to be held in Washington, D.C. from May 1-4, 2011. Substitute costs for one teacher of Tec Voc High School for up to two days (total 2 days) was approved.
