Our Daily 5 is still going strong. Please continue to complete home reading with the books in the coloured book bags. Many of the students will have the same books in their bags for a few days. This is to ensure they are understanding and mastering the book. As discussed at Parent teacher, the groups are either working on letter sounds or reading comprehension. Depending on which goals we discussed, please either help your child pay attention to the letters in the word (ex. beginning sound) or discuss the books and ask questions for comprehension.



In social studies we just finished our first unit about community and cultures. We explored and "walked around" different countries on Google Maps and listed all the different countries the students in our class are from. It's always wonderful to discuss all of the progress your children are making and I know the students were excited to share their animal research projects and dioramas. At the beginning of November, we discussed Remembrance Day, why we wear a poppy and read stories about honouring veterans. The class created beautiful poppy art and wrote about what peace means to them. The students were excellent at our Remembrance Day service. On November 20, the school enjoyed a




Grade 3 & 4 News by Mr. Young

In music we are learning our winter concert songs. Our class is doing a fast dance about winter fun. We are also performing in the choir, and doing a recorder song for the concert. We hope you can all make it out. In math right now some students are learning about length and perimeter and measurement. We are also working on our problem solving skills. We also do the math computer program dreambox. It gives each student their own individualized math topics to work on. In writing we are doing guick writes and journal writing. In quick writes, we get a prompt to write about like Favorite Memories for example. In journal writing we write about things that happen in our life and experiences we have. Some people do picture writing. We have many opportunities to practice our reading throughout the day. In the morning the computer reads to us during our daily 5 rotations. Then in the afternoon we do some silent reading and then Mr. Young reads aloud to us. We are currently reading the book "Ereths Birthday" by Avi. This is the third book in the series that we have been reading so far. The story is about a grumpy porcupine that has to take care of three fox kits when there mother dies in a human trap. Also during our daily 5 rotations we practice reading in small groups with people of our own reading level. In art we have been learning how to draw using video lessons and also art and craft projects. We just made some snowflakes today. In Physical Education class we are learning about playing Tchoukball. It is a game that uses a ball and the players have to work together to pass the ball down the court and try to shoot on the net. There is not goal just a net that you have to bounce the ball on and then catch it afterwards. We all really hope you can make it to our winter concert. Also we all hope you can contribute to our winter concert "Spa basket". Mr Young sent out a post on Seesaw, we are looking for items such as soap, bath balms, wine, bubble bath, chocolate, scrubbing device or anything you feel would be a good addition to help someone unwind and pamper themselves. Grade 5 & 6 News by Mr. Tosczak

This month was super exciting and we are so glad that you are here reading this to learn all about it. Here is what our room did during the last month. There are definitely so many things to discuss.

In ELA, we have been writing polar expression stories. Our polar expression stories are for a contest, where the winners will have their story published in a polar expression book! The rules are that we have to keep the stories under 450 words but over 300 words, which is quite challenging. It's been pretty fun writing our stories because we're allowed to write about anything we like. Even though it takes a lot of steps to go over our work and peer edit, we have been enjoying writing our polar expression stories. Even if we don't win, we've still been really excited to become authors and enter a real writing contest!

In Science we have continued to learn about flight. We finished our research on the different forces (lift, weight, thrust, and drag) that impact flight. We have spent a large amount of time learning about the properties of air and the parts of an airplane. However, the most exciting thing we have done is create our own paper airplanes using our knowledge of flight and after numerous tests and adjustments we had a large competition in the gym to see which plane would travel the furthest. A huge shout out to Madison who had her plane travel almost 1700 meters to take 1st place. One more exciting thing, is that we are going to the Royal Aviation Museum of Western Canada on December 8th. It will be a blast!!!

So far, school has gone great! We learn new amazing things everyday. Also, a quick reminder that our winter concert is on Tuesday December 19th and students in our room need to wear black, white or red. Please continue to check seesaw to see snapshots of our learning.

How is it already December? It seemed like the year is flying by once again. We had a very busy month in our classroom and we can't wait to tell you about it.



Thank you for reading our newsletter. Our Winter Concert Raffle Basket theme is "Coffee, Tea, and Sweets." See you there!











Do not Walk, Skate, or Play on Frozen Retention Ponds

Retention ponds are never safe to use for winter recreation activities. Ice conditions can change quickly without warning, and falling through the ice can be deadly. Remind your children to stay away from frozen retention ponds. Keep dogs on leashes when walking near a retention pond so they don't run onto the ice.



Do not walk, skate, or play on frozen retention ponds. Talk to your children about staying away from the ice.



Do not place hockey nets, benches, light structures, or any other items on a frozen retention pond. To report a structure or item on a retention pond, contact 311.



If you see someone on a retention pond, call 911.

Water from snowmelt or nearby water main breaks can drain into retention ponds. This water is often mixed with street salts, which can cause ice to melt and thin unevenly. This water enters retention ponds from underneath the ice, resulting in thinning of ice that can't be seen from the surface.
