Preparations have started for our next performance on Monday, December 15. The Winter concert will take place at Seven Oaks Performing Arts Centre starting at 6:30P.M.


Notes will be sent home with further information about transportation to/from the concert, as well as various dates when Sistema may be cancelled. Please check with your students about these important notes home.



Rm 209 – Grade 5

For our Beyond the Backyard inquiry project, Room 209 has been working to answer the questions "who are we?" and "where do we come from?". We started by looking at George Ella Lyon's poem "Where I'm From" and asking ourselves about the memories, people, and places that help shape who we are. From brainstorming and expanding to multiple rough drafts, each student worked to create a poem that showcased who they are and what is important to them. They then created a miniature room that represented who they are.







Rm 111(NK) and 120(Grade 3)

Once a week, the Grade 3 students from Room 120 have the opportunity and pleasure of learning with the Nursery and Kindergarten students from Room 111. The students quickly bonded with their "buddies" and often share how much they look forward to spending this period together. The students begin their time together by practicing their reading and communication skills with each other. Afterwards, they work on their social skills through play and exploration activities. 


Rm 210 + 211 – Grade 6

In the month of November, the Grade 6 students have been working hard on a STEM project in Science. As part of our unit on the solar system, we learned about the Mars Rovers sent to Mars to search for signs of life. Our project was to design and engineer an arm for a Dash robot to collect an artifact and deliver it to a pickup site. Students had to code the robot's movement from starting in a crater, following a path to pick up the artifact, and then to bring it to the rocket pick up site. Students had to use design skills, measuring skills, coding skills, and most importantly, group work skills to complete this project.

Five Things We Learned


- Racism hurt everyone

Tin by tin, we truly win.






Friendly Reminders
