## A glimpse into this year's learning:

## Math (les mathématiques)

Grade 2: In grade 2 we begin working with numbers up to 100.

- Representing numbers up to 100 , place value for 2 -digit numerals, addition and subtraction with 2-digit numerals, increasing and decreasing numbers patterns up to 100, repeating patterns, measurement, 2D and 3D shapes, mental math strategies, etc.

Grade 3: In grade 3 we begin working with numbers up to 1000.

- Representing numbers up to 1000, place value for 3-digit numerals, addition and subtraction with 3-digit numerals, increasing and decreasing number patterns up to 1000, multiplication up to $5 \times 5$ and related division facts, beginning understanding of fractions, telling time, mental math strategies, etc.


## Science (les sciences)

- Air and Water in the Environment
- Growth and Changes in Plants/Soils in the Environment
- Materials and Structures


## Social Studies (les sciences humaines)

- Connecting with Canada
- Communities of the World
- Ancient Societies


## English Language Arts (l'anglais)

- ELA is taught using a combination of whole-group writing activities/lessons and small-group centre-based literacy learning. Main focuses are: Reading progression and comprehension, communication, and various writing traits (ideas, organization, spelling, voice, etc.). We explore language as a tool to read, write, represent, listen, speak, and view.


## French Language Arts (le français)

- FLA is taught using a combination of whole-group lessons, daily vocabulary and communication activities, and small-group centre-based literacy learning. Main focuses are: Reading progression and comprehension, vocabulary, communicating simple ideas, and writing traits (sentence structure, spelling, word choice).


## Art (l'art)

- Students will explore visual arts, dance and performing arts.
