We have all appreciated the fair October weather, but as we head toward colder temperatures, it's worth remembering that at École Luxton School, students will go outside every day at recess no matter the weather - only when temperatures are extreme do we stay inside. REMEMBRANCE DAY CEREMONY

In November, we will honour the sacrifices made for peace in our Remembrance Day service. The service will focus on the theme *Service, Courage and Sacrifice – At home, around the world and across generations*. 2024 marks the 100th Anniversary of the Royal Canadian Air Force.

A CAF Corporal Ola Babolola is coming to Luxton to speak to our middle years students about life in the Canadian military.

The ceremony will take place on **Friday, November 8**th beginning at 10:45 AM. Our music teacher, Ms Drewniak, has put together a student choir to sing at the event.

SAFF ARRIVAL

Safe Arrival is the system the school uses to verify student attendance. It's easy to report your child's absence. With Safe Arrival, please report your child's absence in advance using any of three convenient methods:

- 1. Using your mobile device, download and install the School Messenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca).
- 2. Use the Safe Arrival website, https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account > Select Attendance > then Report an Absence.
- 3. Call the toll-free number 1-855-278-4513 to report an absence the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

All calls to the Safe Arrival system should be made before 9:00 AM or after 4:30 PM.

When the system calls you regarding your child's absence, listen to the whole message and respond at the end. It is not necessary to call the school if you follow the prompts.

UNIVERSALLY ACCESSIBLE SNACK PROGRAM

At the start of October, Luxton began offering a snack new program. Any child can have the food that is available. Long-time staff member, **Carolyn Lotz**, has taken on the role of Luxton's food coordinator. High quality, nutritious snacks are made available to classrooms in snack bins each morning. We are observing all guidelines for food safety. The program is supported by funds from the Winnipeg School Division as well as a grant from the Child Nutrition Council of Manitoba.

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MUSIC

- Ms. Drewniak

This year in music we're reading and writing rhythms, learning how to play instruments, writing songs, and refining routines in dance. The students enjoyed the "Wednesday Dance", and we just finished "Better When I'm Dancing".

The primary students will continue learning singing games, that include movements, patterns and rhythms. We are exploring how syllables can create a variety of rhythms. We learned new songs and games, including ways that animals move to show expression within the music.

The intermediate students have begun to write their own recorder music using rhythms and words, creating tunes using notes that they are familiar with. They will continue to practice their skills for writing and reading music on the staff. Our composer study was about George Frideric Handel and included writing a lifeline, viewing listening maps, movement, comparing and analyzing selections, and creating their own visual of a piece of his musical work. The students in grade 5-7 classes are working on completing their small group dances, choosing their own song and writing choreography to present to each other.

We have a choir group that has been rehearsing a song for the Remembrance Day assembly on Friday, November 8. We will begin working on our class performances and choir selections for the Winter concert in December. Hope to see you at the school and I look forward to the students' performances.

CONFERENCE SCHEDULING WITH SCHOOL INTERVIEWS

In November, École Luxton School will use *School Interviews*, a webbased app used for organizing parent conferences. November features



Tri-Conferences, a format where parents, grades 1 – 7 students, and teachers talk together about student progress and achievement. It's a three-way conversation. In Nursery and Kindergarten, the format is more traditional parent-teacher conferences, a meeting between teacher and parent to discuss growth and achievement.

These conferences will be held on the evening of **Thursday, November 21**st and during the day on **Friday, November 22**nd. Each appointment will be a maximum of ten minutes long and will be held in-person. Report cards will be distributed electronically at the latest on **Tuesday, November 19**th.

Please book these conferences in the School Interviews App with your child's classroom teacher. Appointments with specialist teachers are available and you can see them just dropping in (Mr. Kaye, Physical Education; Ms. Drewniak, Music; Mr. McCartney, Ms. Castelli-Harms, Ms. Kelsh, Ms. Zeglinski, Mr. Nickerson).

When you click on the link below, you will be able to access your account or create a new one. Then, you can enter your children's names and schedule interview times. Once you choose and confirm interview times, you will receive an email confirmation message with connection information. You can save the appointment in your smartphone calendar.

Luxton Community Centre runs a **free breakfast program** every school day from 8:00AM to 10:00AM.


All children, youth and their families are welcome to attend.

Ms Zeglinski has purchased the *Kelso's Choice—Conflict Management* curriculum, to support our students in gaining valuable interpersonal skills. Following, are some of the student goals we will be working on together:



- Students will differentiate between minor and serious problems.
- Students will be able to understand the source of conflict when they are experiencing a minor problem.
- Students will be able to describe their personal reaction to conflict.
- Students will develop the skills necessary to solve minor problems.
- Students will understand which of the choices works best for them.
- Students will be able to identify adults who are in their personal safety support system.
