MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Hello Luxton Families!

I want to share with all families that I am feeling so fortunate to be a school leader in a school with such a committed, sincere and talented staff. Furthermore, Luxton students and caregivers have been so generous in offering support for our school.

September has been a month of establishing routines and launching learning. We're focused on supporting positive behaviour that leads to classrooms that are calm, engaged, and learning.

Playground

Our school year is off to a tremendous start. The Mary Kardash Child Care Centre funded an extension to the playground in front. Playgrounds-R-Us installed the new equipment, including a place to balance on, climb over, rock back and forth, and crawl under. There's even a communication board for those who need it. The play structure is surrounded by a deep layer of natural wood fibre. Our youngest Luxton students are buzzing about the chance to try out the new structures.

Family Centre

The Family Centre (affectionately called 'Room 66') is restarting programming on Tuesdays and Thursdays starting in October. The centre has offered early years literacy programming for caregivers and incoming preschoolers, as well as adult programming. Ms. Banasiuk is coordinating the resumption of programming. At Luxton, we're very excited about this relaunch.

Technology

In the classroom, we've also renewed a few pieces of technology that have been aging out. The music room's video projector quit, but she now has a large screen monitor in its place. We've added three new document cameras in classrooms and replaced some obsolete iPads. Our next goal is to refresh our supply of Chromebooks so that we have one for each student in grades 3-6, and to outfit our gymnasium with a A/V system.

Books and Resources

Our French Immersion programme is new and it will take time for the school to acquire the books and resources it needs to support the program. However, we received funds from the French Revitalization Grant, and we are in the process of acquiring books. We've also ordered books for our English program students with a credit we have from Scholastic Book Fairs.

Clubs and Sports

Patrols are a great opportunity for student leadership. Thank you to Mrs. DerochieLotz and Ms. Prince for leading our patrols this year. Ms. Howard and Mrs. Chan are restarting an extracurricular opportunity called Kuamini. Thanks to Mr. Kay for getting intermural soccer up and running!

ACKNOWLEDGING THE TRUTH AND SUPPORTING THE RESURGENCE

This week École Luxton School staff and students engaged in conversations about the legacy of the residential school system in Canada. They visited with elders at the Kapamayak Achaak Healing Forest at St. John's Park.

Around a fire, the students learned about the significance of ceremony and medicine, and how residential schools were designed to eradicate Indigenous cultures. Our students tied orange ribbons to our front fence and wore orange shirts to signify our school's commitment to Truth and Reconciliation.

In our classrooms, we acknowledge the historic harm caused to Indigenous people. Our classrooms are also places where, beyond wearing an orange shirt on one day, we work towards children attaining their share of <u>Mamàhtawisiwin</u> (*The Good Life*).





In early October, students will explore the Indigenous Peoples Atlas of Canada. It contains opportunities for students to see the cultural geography of Canada before colonization, and a timeline chronicling the changes over time.


SCIENCE LITERACY

Facilitators from the Monarch Teacher Network

came to École Luxton School to help our students learn about Monarch butterflies. Do you know how to distinguish a male from a female? The male monarchs have black dots on their hindwings, while the



females have thicker black lines on their wings.

Students in Mrs. Chan's room 18 and Ms. Howard's Room 9 witnessed a caterpillar got through the life cycle, emerging from its Chrysalis and spreading its wings. These butterflies were released into the trees at the front of the school. The photograph on the right is the Room 18 Monarch.

From the presentation, students learned about butterfly migration, life span, functions, and habitat. They also learned that, because of human activity, their habitat is disappearing: lawns are no good, and neither are farmer's fields. In Mexico, deforestation is threatening the Monarchs. We can help by planting flowers and milkweed.


LUXTON COMMUNITY CENTRE BREAKFAST NEWS
