#### Grade 1 & 2 News by Ms. Brar

Hello, Room 209 families! It is my pleasure to become the new homeroom teacher for grades 1 and 2 at Prairie Rose School. I'm very excited to work with you and your child for the rest of the school year.

Beginning in January, we have spent some time getting back to our daily routines. We start our day with a morning message and riddle, where students love brainstorming with each other. In ELA, we are continuing to do daily 5 where students rotate to different stations that involve reading to themselves, reading to someone else, word work, writing, and guided reading. Please continue to support your child in finishing their home reading and spelling word assignments. In math, we are learning about Canadian coins and bills. We are also learning about addition mental math strategies and addition with regrouping. In science, we have finished our objects and material unit, where the students have learned about the different materials and their suitability for a particular function. We are also learning about healthy eating habits and personal hygiene. In art, we continue exploring different art materials to create unique art pieces.


This is how we have started off our learning journey, and I hope that together, we will support our children in reaching their learning goals.

#### Grade 1 & 2 News by Ms. Nassar

We had a great first month of 2024.

In math we have been working hard on subtraction and shapes. Many students have made a goal to learn how to count backwards fluently. Please practice at home – it can be as simple as a countdown each morning or at dinner.

In ELA, your child is working on predicting and understanding what they read. Before they read a book we are discussing what it might be about solely based on the title of the book. While doing home reading it is a good idea to have a discussion about the book before, during and after reading. This will help with comprehension. We also started a trial of a program called "Reading Eggs" which follows the science of reading very closely. The students love it! If you want to check it out at home, go to the website and the students can login with their username: firstname+eggs (no spaces) and they will know their passwords.

We have just about finished our second science unit, objects and materials. The unit was very vocabulary

heavy, but the students now know words such as absorbent, waterproof, rigid, pliable, and so much more. We will be moving on to social studies where we will learn all about Canada.

We are excited for February and will celebrate I Love to Read Month with some fun guest readers, 100 Day and Valentine's Day.




#### Grade 3 & 4 News by Mr. Young

We have been learning about column addition and subtraction as a strategy for adding and subtracting three digit numbers. Next we will be expanding our knowledge of skip counting and applying it to multiplication facts and problems. We have also been working on problem solving strategies for different types of problems like guess and check, make an organized list, using logical reasoning and so on. We have been playing math games. In creative writing some students are creating long stories and typing them up on the computer. In the computer lab we have been doing math practice on Dreambox. In reading we have been working on comprehension strategies. Mr. Young is using Rime Magic for emergent readers focusing on word and letter sounds and word families. During lunches we are practicing our running, jumping and throwing for the track meet at the end of February.

#### Grade 3 & 4 News by Mrs. Simons

February?! Wow! Didn't we just get back from winter break? As usual, we have been busy, busy, busy! New Math, Social Studies and Health units, along with Writing and art projects have helped make the cold month of January seem to fly by! In Math, we have been focusing on addition and subtraction, Number Talks and Math Strings. Mental math strategies have been explored and practiced using various activities. Students have been having fun with new math games as well. Ask your child to teach you how to play "Doubles, Race to 100." It's a good one! Next month, we'll start to learn about measurement and time. We started the new unit, Exploring the World in Social Studies in January. So far, we have been looking at the different continents, oceans of the world, countries and their borders and Basic Human Rights. The students enjoyed a quick mini research project on different countries. This unit will continue into February where we will learn about organizations that support communities and making a difference. We worked through the writing process with our "The Night My Snowman Came Alive" stories. After reading the book, "Snowmen at Night", students created their own stories while focusing on each step of the writing process (Pre-writing, Rough Draft, Editing, Revising, and Publishing/Good Draft). Once completed, we used chalk pastels to create our beautiful snowmen at night artwork to accompany our stories. We also created winter landscapes in art. This project had us focusing on colour, shape, space, value and perspective. Students also worked hard at creating multimedia hot chocolate artwork where they looked at colour, shape and pattern while using paper, different kinds of paint and cotton balls! In Health, we began the Thrival program, which focuses on Mental Health awareness and well-being. Next month we will start a new class novel, continue with Daily 5 and Reading and dive into our spelling program. We are all excited about I Love to Read Month and Valentine's Day! Have a wonderful February!

#### Gr. 5 & 6 News by Mr. Tosczak

Hello Parents/Guardians! We are going to be telling you what we have been doing in January. We are very excited to share all of the neat things we have been exploring this past month! We hope you have a lot of fun reading!

In ELA, we have started a couple new things. We have begun our new novel study on the book "Wonder" by RJ Palacio. This book is about a boy who begins school for the first time in grade 5 because of a medical condition that he has and his struggles with his peers accepting him. So far it is really good and we can't wait to see what happens next. We have also started using a new reading program called "Reading Eggs" It is a lot of fun and a nice alternative to Raz Kids. We continue to practice our accuracy, fluency and comprehension using this program. Did you know we can use Raz Kids and Reading Eggs for our home reading?

In Social Studies we have been researching the first people that lived in Canada long before it was ever a country called Canada. Every student has been working on learning about the first people that lived in a different region in Canada (Plains, Northwest Coast, Eastern Woodlands, Eastern Subarctic, Western Subarctic, Plateau and the Arctic). After researching their region, we prepared google slide presentations which we presented to the classroom. It was really interesting and we had our classmates teach us about the other regions. Some of them even gave us a guiz to see if we listened.

In science, we have been learning about the weather. So far, we have discussed what the atmosphere is and the different layers that protect us from things like the sun. We have also learned about what weather is and how it is different from climate. Did you know that the sun is responsible for all the different weather that we have on our planet? We also have started to learn about the different tools we use to measure and predict weather such as barometers, thermometers and Rain Gauges.

That is all from us! We hope you liked reading our newsletter and enjoyed hearing all of the fun things we did this past month. We cannot wait for more learning!

#### Gr. 5 & 6 Student News by Mr. Forbister

Another month has come and gone in our classroom, and we've been very busy. We got off to the new year running!

In ELA, we started our new novel, Howl's Moving Castle. This is the story of a girl named Sophie who is turned into an old woman by a witch. She goes to try to find a cure and makes a deal with a fire demon named Calcifer who lives with a wizard named Howl. This has been a really interesting book so far and we can't wait to see where it ends. We also started the Reading Eggs program at school. This is a new website that has a lot of books and some really cool rewards for doing activities. We have had a lot of fun with it.

In math, we worked on problem solving, open ended questions, and multiplication and division work. We have learned different ways to start solving problems and ways to check our answers. It can be tough at times, but finding the answer on our own feels really good.

In Social Studies, we learned more about Canada and the development of the Hudson's Bay Company. We looked at how the English and French fought for European control of the trade and how different Indigenous group helped to fight for each side in the war. We also started our Weather unit in Science. We've had lots of different weather this month, so we are curious to see how it is caused.

Next month will be I Love to Read month, so make sure to look at what kinds of dress-up days we are going to have!





#### Physical Education News by Ms. McFadyen

During the month of January, the students in grades 5 and 6 practiced hard for our volleyball tournament. We also started practicing for our Track Meet that will be held on February 27<sup>th</sup> at Max Bell Centre. Students will get a chance to compete against other schools in running, jumping and throwing events. All of the events are team events and include relay races, shot put and long jump. Students will continue to practice at lunch to prepare for the Track Meet.

Students are also learning how to play badminton during Phys. Ed class. Students will learn to serve the birdie and will learn a variety of shots.

#### Music News

This month we have started learning about the percussion family. It is the largest group of music families and includes instruments that are not really instruments, such as the sounds from spoons to piano and from xylophones to triangles. It isn't just about drums! Percussion is anything that can keep a beat or make a rhythm.

We have been using percussion when exploring the music of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. He may have died over 225 years ago, but his music lives on. The students have played along to such pieces as "Eine Kleine Nauchtmusik" and the "Turkish March". Students in grades 3 – 6 are even able to play his music on the recorder. We will begin creating our own interpretative compositions of "Twinkle, Twinkle", just like Mozart did, writing and practising so we can perform them for our classmates.

The grade 5 and 6 students have begun keyboarding and learning I, IV, V7 chords. Music is patterns and math: rhythms based on subdivisions of time and fractions, done instantaneously, internally. Chords have a pattern to them, and once you know it, it becomes something you can do, even when the music key changes. Next month we will continue with learning and researching about Mozart, as well as start on the brass family. We have some fun choir songs that we will continue to practice.

#### **Buses & Transportation**

#### Bus cancellation:

During the school year there may be times when school bus transportation is cancelled due to inclement weather or poor driving conditions, but schools will remain open. School bus transportation for all school divisions in



the City of Winnipeg is cancelled when the wind chill reaches -45° C by 6:15 a.m. based on the Environment Canada readings in Winnipeg. When bus transportation is cancelled in the morning, it will not resume later in the day even if weather conditions improve. All major Winnipeg media outlets are contacted in the early morning and are asked that they broadcast and/or post bus cancellation information.

#### Severe Weather Conditions:

Severe weather conditions and poor roads may extend the running time of some buses, resulting in late arrival and departure. Parents/guardians should make sure that children are suitably clothed until picked up and that they have a place to go in the event the bus does not arrive. Parents/guardians must also ensure that children have a place to go after the return trip.





Before the bell time of the current day, call 1-855-278-4513 or visit https://go.schoolmessenger.ca to report your student's absence

Please note that all students who are not in attendance at school during any given day, are part of the school-wide call back system.

Teachers report the names of children who are absent, and if the parent of the absent child has not called the Safe Arrival Call In System at 1-855-278-4513 to report their absence, they will be notified by phone at their home or workplace regarding the student's absence by the automated system.

They will continue to be called every 5 minutes until they verify the absence. In order to ensure the safety of our students, it is imperative that parents/guardians notify the school of any absences or late arrivals. Students who arrive at school late are instructed to call the office once at Cohort door for a staff member to pick them up.

#### **TRAFFIC SAFETY:**

Parents, please help keep your children safe. Would you please reinforce safety messages with your children!



- Children should be reminded that at this time of the year vehicles often have a difficult time stopping suddenly on slippery streets.
- When walking to and from school, children should cross at intersections with the school patrols.

#### Louis Riel Day, Monday February 21st

Make plans to celebrate Manitoba's Louis Riel Day, February 19, with your family.



#### Louis Riel

Louis Riel was a passionate Métis leader. He was a catalyst in the events that occurred making Manitoba become Canada's fifth province and joining confederation in 1870. Louis Riel had a dream of a civilized world that embraces all cultures. This dream is celebrated by all Manitobans on Louis Riel Day.

Why Remember Louis Riel? Louis Riel is recognized as an advocate of justice for the Métis people, but he represents much more. He helped lay the framework for minority rights and cultural co-operation, and is regarded as a founder of Manitoba. It is very important to remember Louis Riel's contribution to Canada.

Commemorating Louis Riel. A resolution was passed by parliament citing Louis Riel's role in the Founding of Manitoba on 10 March 1992.

On 26 September 2007, Manitoba legislature passed a bill establishing a statutory holiday on the third Monday in February as Louis Riel Day, the same day some other provinces celebrate Family Day, beginning in 2008. The first Louis Riel Day was celebrated on 18 February 2008. This new statutory holiday coincides with the annual celebration of the Festival du Voyageur in Winnipeg.
