Every effort has been made to assign students to their chosen option courses, however, due to timetable conflicts or limited space, some may be placed in alternate options. Given the large Grade 9 enrollment, course change requests cannot be met.

KELVIN GUIDANCE COUNSELLORS:

All students have been assigned a guidance counsellor, with their name listed at the top of student timetables. Counsellors can help with academics, personal support, and referrals to outside resources. Parents/guardians are welcome to contact. HOMEROOM/ADVISORS:

Each Grade 9 student is assigned a Homeroom Teacher/Advisor, which is their A slot teacher. Advisors share written information for parents/guardians, and all School Messenger communications are also posted on our website under the [COMMUNITY AND FAMILY](#) tab.

All Grade 9 students will report to the gym at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday September 9th, 2026 - School Day 2. Only Grade 9 students will have school the morning of the first day. Throughout the morning, they will be involved in various orientation activities with our Grade 12 Mentorship group. Staff and mentors will be available to help guide students.

ACCIDENT INSURANCE

Each family will receive information online for student insurance and parents are strongly advised to consider this carefully, **particularly if your child is involved in sports of any kind.** The Winnipeg School Division is participating in a universal student accident insurance program which provides coverage for all students while en-route to school, at school, and while traveling to and attending any school activity.

ATTENDANCE AND ABSENCE REPORTING (VIA WSD ABSENCE REPORTING SYSTEM—SAFE ARRIVAL)

Our attendance policy will be reviewed with all students on the first day of school. It is an expectation that students are punctual and attend all classes. All student absences must be supported by contacting our [SAFE ARRIVAL](#) system (information about *Safe Arrival* may be found on the school website and is included in this email package). Parents/guardians will be kept informed of attendance patterns through report cards, phone calls or emails from teachers.

CELL PHONES/OTHER ELECTRONICS

As a school community, we are aware of the importance of electronic communication for our students. It is our responsibility both as a school and community to ensure students are accessing those devices at appropriate times/places. Our goal is to allow students to develop skills in using technology in a responsible manner. **Students cannot have cell phones in any learning/classroom space.**

Cell phones/other electronic devices will not be used during learning time in class unless otherwise directed by the classroom teacher. Please speak with your child about our cell phone policy. The school cannot take responsibility for reimbursing the cost of lost or damaged articles.

It is strongly recommended that any items of value be left at home.

BIKE COMPOUND

Students who travel to school may utilize the bike compound to secure their bike during the school day. The compound is located next to the back parking lot and is secured with a coded door. Students will be provided with this code on the first day of school. Students should bring a U-lock to secure their bike within the compound. Bikes should not be left overnight in the compound. The school is not liable for lost or stolen bikes.

YEARBOOK FEE

Pre-orders for the 2026 - 2027 yearbook are \$40 and can be purchased in advance through the Kelvin website, via e-transfer, or at the Kelvin Office (exact cash or cheque). Yearbook sales increase to \$45 after December 31st, 2026. Sales close April 1, 2026, and yearbooks will be ready for pick up at Kelvin High School in the fall of 2027.
