Science:



Community Involvement:



We are building our skills with long division by including decimals and remainders. We have also found out how to use a decimal to find the exact answer without having remainders.


English: We are starting our next unit being writing personal narratives in the new year. We will be adding lots of imagery and descriptive language to our writing.
