As we move into the month of January, please ensure that your children dress appropriately for all weather conditions. Also, please ensure that all of your child's clothing is labeled so that we can return it to the rightful owner. We had some nice weather during the month of December, but I'm sure we will have some cold wintery days. We have an amazing 93 Polar Bear students in grades 1-6! Polar Bear students always have the choice on whether or not they want to come out to play. They must be fully dressed in all their appropriate outdoor winter clothing.

Please try to send your children within minutes of the entry bell. Entry times are 8:20 a.m. and 12:25 p.m. All children are expected to go outside for recess, weather permitting. If children are well enough to be at school, then they are well enough to be outside. If children are ill, we encourage parents to keep them home until they

are feeling well enough to participate in all activities, including recess. This will also help ensure that illnesses are less likely to spread to other children.

Our playground committee is once again creating an "enchanted forest" for our students. Our temporary forest of natural Christmas trees will "grow" along the fence and in the school yard (depending on if there is enough snow to stand them up steady). After you have removed all decorations from your natural tree, you can drop it off by in the corner of the field near the southwest entrance (near the parking lot) any time from December 26 - January 3. Your tree will help create opportunities for more imaginative play and will be incorporated into outdoor education lessons.

SafeArrival **Frequently Asked Questions**

What is SafeArrival?

SafeArrival is an absence management system that improves student safety and makes it easy for you to let the school know about your child's absence.

You are asked to report your child's absence in advance whenever possible using one of these convenient methods:

SchoolMessenger app (free)

- 1. Provide your email address to the school.
- 2. Get the app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https:// go.schoolmessenger.ca).



- 3. Tap **Sign Up** to create your account.
- 4. Select **Attendance** from the menu, and then select Report an Absence.

Web and Mobile Web: go.schoolmessenger.ca

- 1. Provide your email address to the school.
- 2. Go to the website.
- 3. Click **Sign Up** to create your account.
- 4. Select **Attendance** from the menu, then select **Report an Absence**.

Interactive Toll-Free Phone 1-855-278-4513

- 1. Call the toll-free, interactive telephone system.
- 2. Follow the instructions to report an absence.
- 3. Record the confirmation number at the end of the call. If you hang up before this is given the absence will be cancelled and will not be reported to the school.



Whenever an absence is reported or updated, you will receive a confirmation notice by email (assuming you have provided your contact information to the school).

If you don't report your child's absence in advance, the automated notification system will try to contact you (using the communication preferences if you have set them up in the SchoolMessenger app). This may include push notifications to the app, email, or phone calls. You

will be asked to provide the reason for your child's absence immediately. You may do so using the phone line, website or mobile app.

If you try to explain an absence using SafeArrival, but are then told that it is past the cut-off time, please contact the school directly.

If you don't want to receive notifications when your child is absent, be sure to report your child's absence in advance.

If you do receive notifications of your child's absence, be sure to provide the reason as quickly as possible, using one of the 3 methods listed above or during the phone call notification itself.

Absences can be reported in advance:

- 24 hours/day.
- 7 days a week.
- For any school day in the school year.
- Up to the cut-off time on the day of the absence.



Supporting Regular Daily Attendance

Did You Know?

- Missing 10 percent of the school year (or just 2-3 days every month) can mean that by grade three, a student has failed to master basic reading skills, and by grade nine, they are at risk of dropping out of school. Everyday, starting in nursery and kindergarten, students are learning and practicing basic literacy skills in order to be competent readers, spellers, and writers as adults.
- Attending school regularly helps a child feel connected to classmates and staff.
- Regular school attendance every year, starting in nursery and kindergarten, will help your child to do well later in high school, university or college, and at work.

How You Can Help

- No matter their age, set a regular bedtime and morning routine for your child.
- Lay out clothes and backpacks the night before.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to their teacher about this concern. Together, you both can make a plan to help your child.
- When possible, avoid medical appointments or trips with your child when school is in session. Take advantage of non-instructional days, or days during the winter, spring, or summer break to schedule appointments or trips.

School success goes hand in hand with good attendance!




Family Literacy Day

Know Your Zone École Sir William Osler is in Snow Zone F



Usually two or three times per year a residential parking ban is called to facilitate the city's snow clearing operation. All residential streets have been assigned to a snow zone. It's important that all

city residents become familiar with their zone. You can look up your residential street snow zone with the City of Winnipeg address lookup tool or by contacting 311.

The city will announce the snow zone plow schedule prior to a residential plow operation. Vehicles parked in violation of the residential parking ban will receive a \$150 ticket (\$75 if paid early), and may be towed to a nearby street that is not scheduled to be plowed or that has already been cleared.
