Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) Clinic

This CRA clinic offers one-on-one help. Register to reserve a spot. You can register by phone, online or at any Winnipeg Public Library.

This clinic helps with the following services only:

- Applying for benefits (CCB, GST, DTC)
- Answering personal tax questions (no trusts, business or farming)
- Updating information (address, direct deposit, contact information)
- Printing letters or Proof of Income Statements (Option C)

Registration opens 2 weeks prior to event date at 10 a.m. You can register for one CRA clinic only at a time. On the day of the CRA Clinic, the order of when you are seen will depend on when you check in at the branch. Check in starts 30 minutes prior to the clinic start time. Limited walk-ins will be taken if time allows, or if spots are not yet filled.

Grades 1 and 2

Hello everyone! My name is Ms. Eleno, and I am thankful to have this wonderful opportunity to teach and learn with our students at Rm. 7 this December. We had lots of fun integrating a play-based learning approach to support the building of our students' creativity, communication, social-emotional, and problem-solving skills.

For **Math**, we explored the units of time, particularly reading and telling time to the half hour. In **ELA**, we continued to build both reading and writing stamina through read-to-self activities and journaling using more complex, multiple sentences. **Art**, while connected throughout subject areas, mainly focused on winter and holiday themes. We worked on art pieces that reflected the diversity of winter holiday celebrations, developing fine motor skills, literacy, and numeracy in the process.

Our class learned more about fire prevention, participated in a holiday sale, celebrated birthdays together, and prepared for the winter break with much excitement. It has been lovely working with everyone in Rm. 7, and I look forward to seeing more of their learning progress in the following month.

Grades 1 and 2

In December, our class explored many exciting topics! In **Math**, we learned about place value: how numbers are made of groups of tens and ones. Students enjoyed building numbers with Digi-Blocks and KEVA planks, which made learning hands-on and fun! In social studies, we discovered different winter celebrations, focusing on **Hanukkah**. We learned about traditions like lighting the menorah, playing dreidel, eating foods such as latkes, and sharing the history of the holiday. In **Literacy**, students worked on writing and sight words, created their own books, shared them with classmates, and practiced self-assessment to see how many goals they met. It was a month full of learning and creativity!





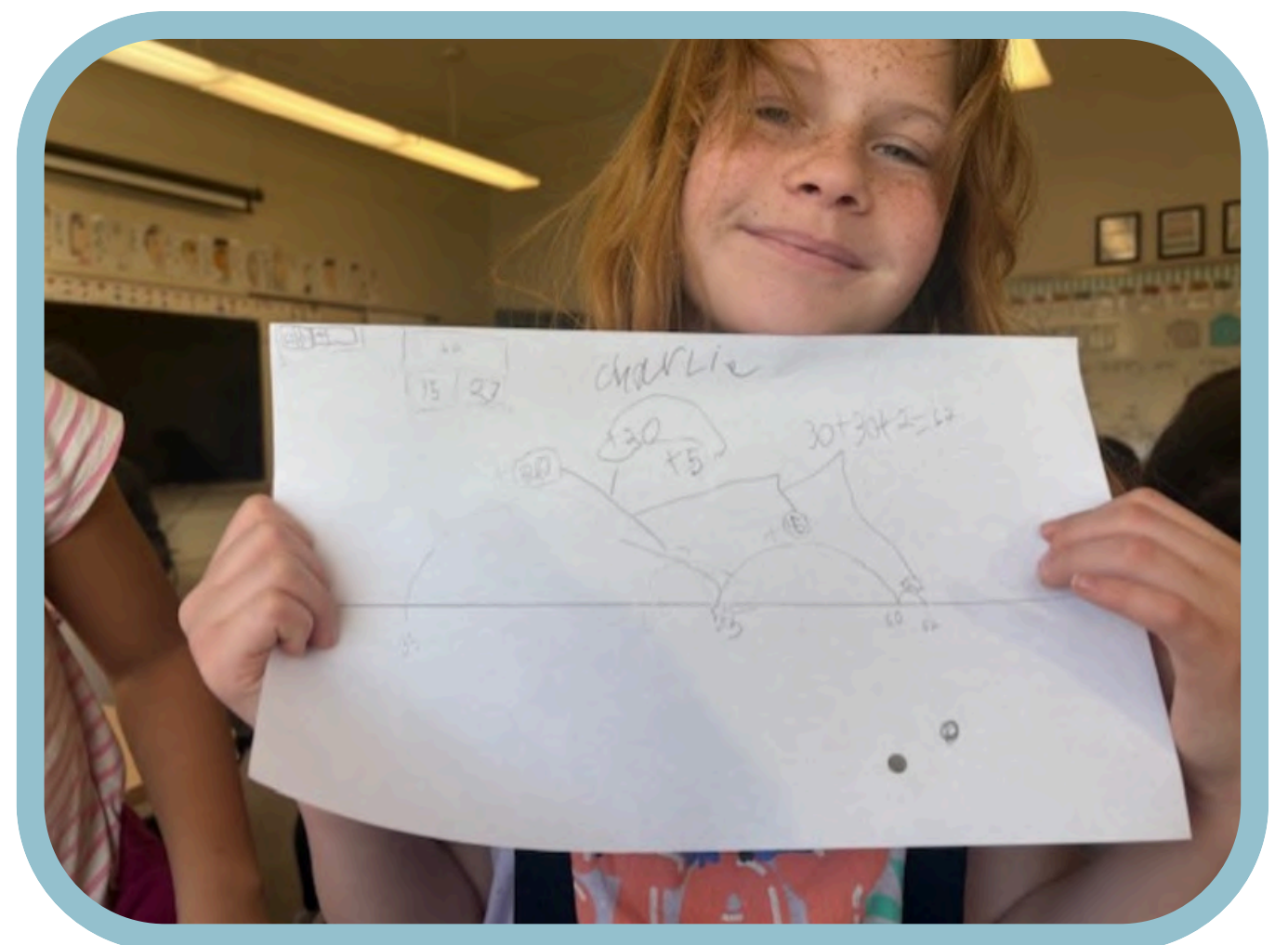
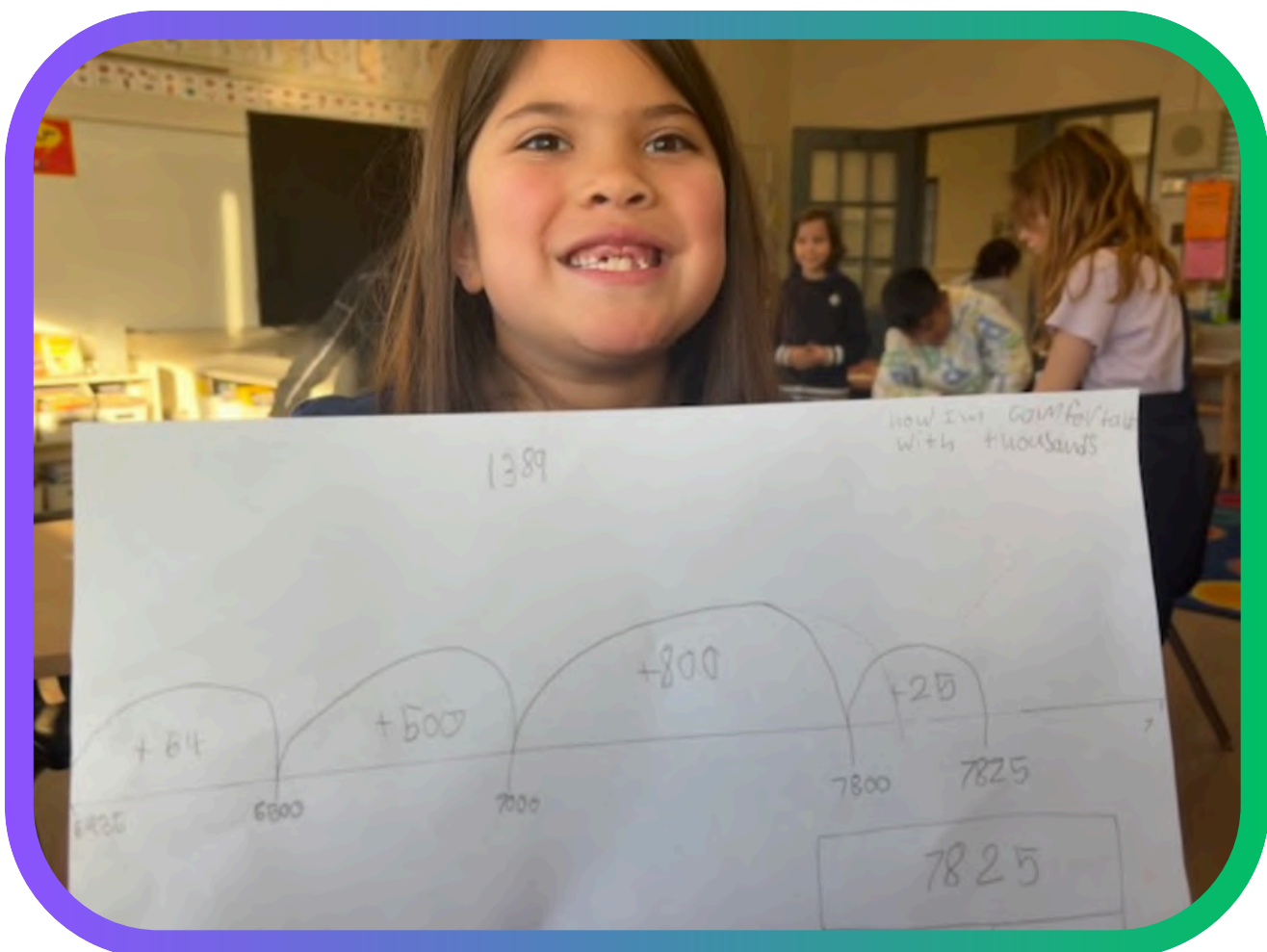
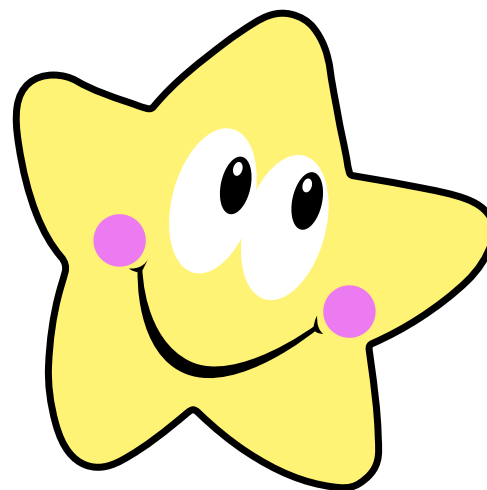

Math Focus : Subtraction Superstars !!!

In December, Room 4 (Grade 3/4) was busy building strong subtraction skills in math. We spent a lot of time exploring subtraction using helpful models such as number lines and part-whole boxes. These tools supported students in visualizing their thinking and explaining how they arrived at their answers, helping to deepen their understanding of how numbers work together.

One strategy the students especially loved was **Think Addition**.

By asking themselves, “*What do I need to add to get to the larger number?*”, students gained confidence and accuracy when solving subtraction problems. It was wonderful to see their enthusiasm grow—many students began challenging themselves with larger numbers, and some even created their own tricky subtraction questions to solve and share with classmates. Room 4 showed great perseverance, creativity, and a real excitement for learning as they tackled these mathematical challenges!

In Room 3 we have learnt a lot about the fur trade. Students have been taken on a journey where they learnt all about the fur trade. They got chances to learn about the animals of the fur trade, as well as how they got around Canada. The students also learnt about how the land helped us to decide which form of transportation we choose. Finally, students got to learn all about **the Hudson's Bay Company** and **the North West Company**. This culminated in a project where the students had to use critical thinking to imagine what it felt like to work in the fur trade.

"I felt really curious," Zoey said. She continued to say, "I felt excited, crafty, and passionate. I was very excited to start and to learn. I learnt a lot about trapping, and the voyageurs. I learnt about how their life was hard."

Grades 3 & 4

The students in Room 3 were lucky enough to be able to have real beaver fur in the class. The students were given the chance to explore and understand the fur. Students explained that before they felt the fur they had some fears. Some students were brave and took the leap in, which helped them all realize the fur was soft and comfy feeling. After they felt it they got to learn about how it becomes fur, and why. Students were also given the chance to explore some of the weirder aspects of the fur. Students were confused about which animal it was, but they learnt it was a type of beaver, called the sand beaver.

"The class was curious and interested during the fur trade." Will and Bintu agreed. This was very evident, as they were always asking questions, and trying to learn more.

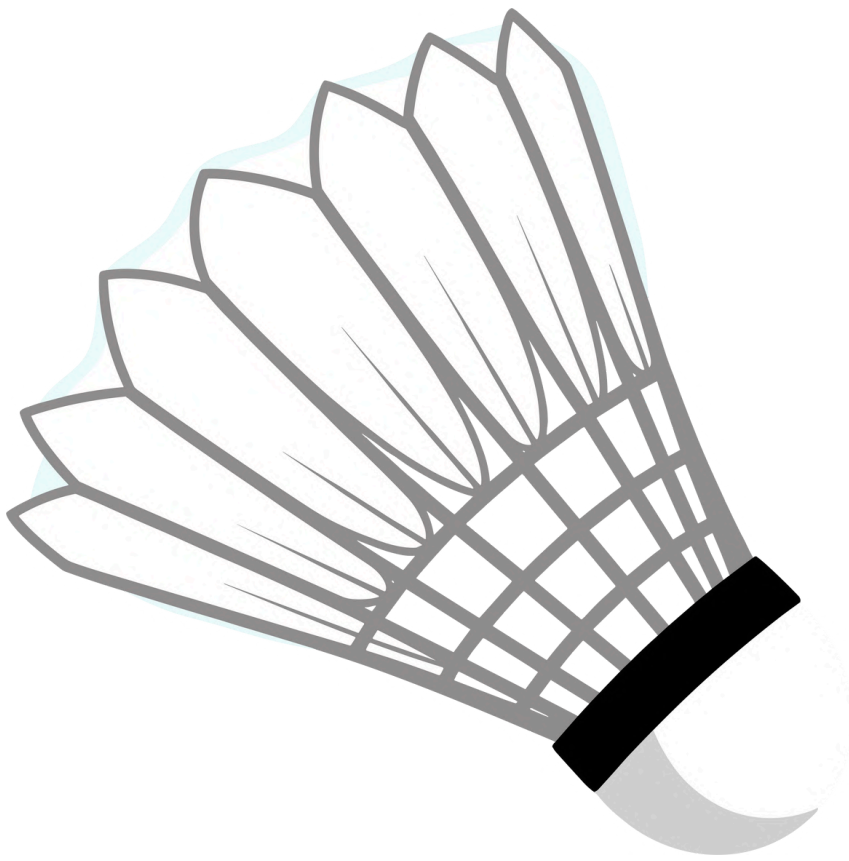
