## FOOTBALL CLUB



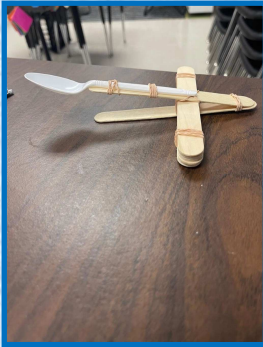
Mr. Pollock & Mr. Frances getting ready to coach the Bombers to a Grey Cup win next year, but first, Football Club!

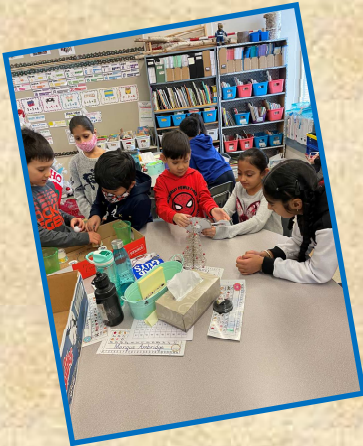
Our winner of \$25.00 in books for themselves and their teacher was Blake in Mrs. Kurek's classroom. Congratulations to them and all the winners of posters.

A huge **thank you** goes out to Ms. Kostal and Mrs. Golebioski for their help in the evening to make the book fair possible.

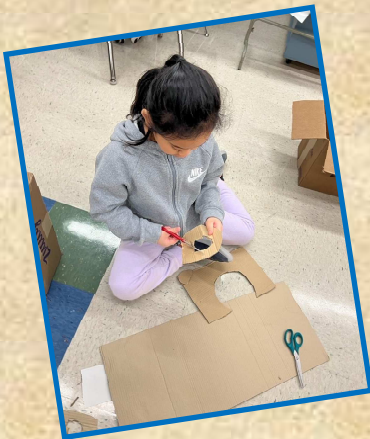

## GRADE 2 ARCADE



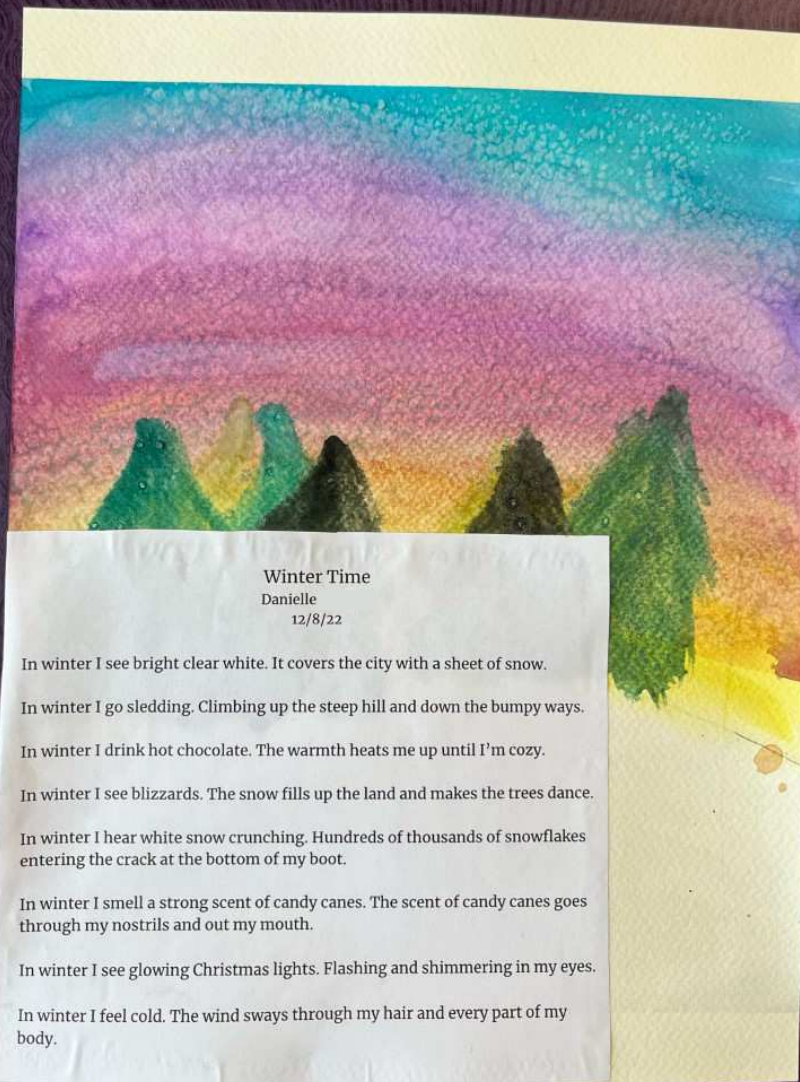
The grade 2 classrooms have been hard at work creating and building arcade games to share. Classrooms and staff are invited to come down and try their luck at some the games.



Students use recycled materials such as boxes, plastic jugs, etc. to create their own game and then recycle the materials afterwards or take their projects home to share with family. Good luck!



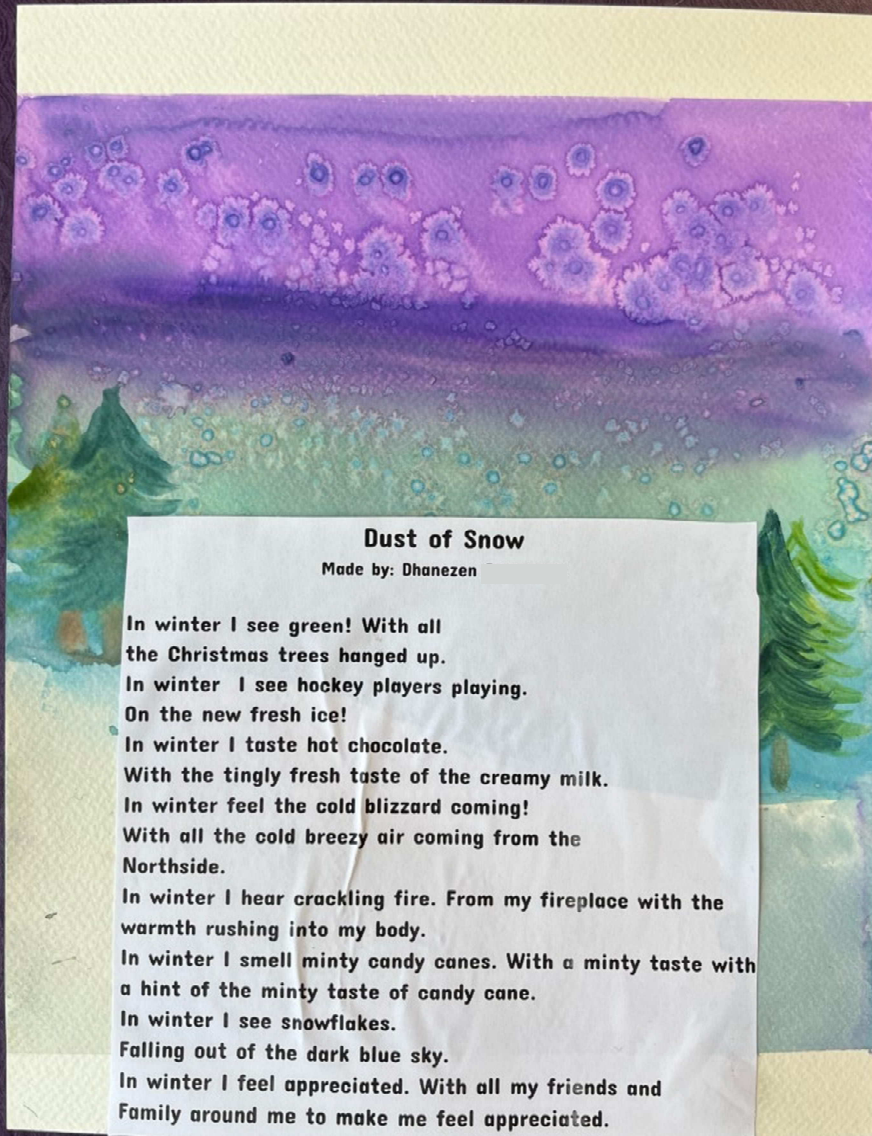
## WINTER POETRY FROM ROOM 9

# HOLIDAY CARDS



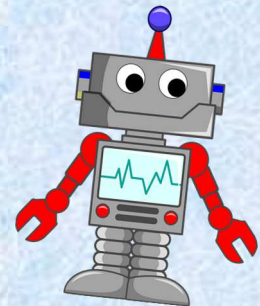
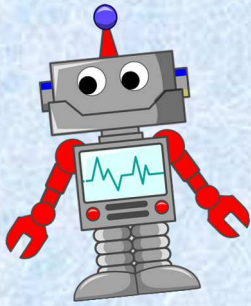

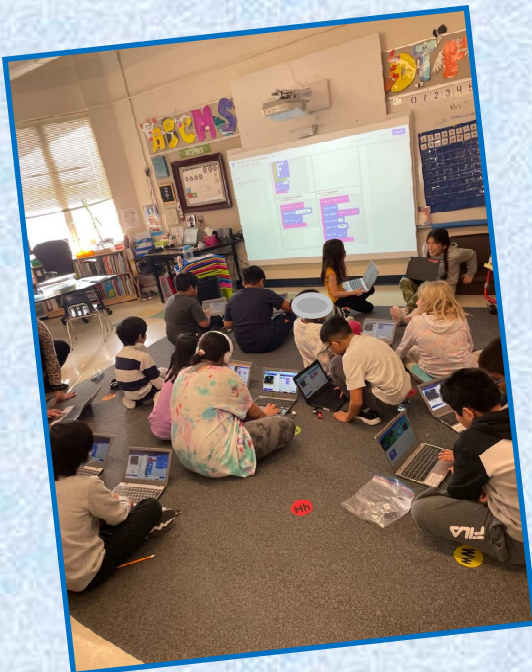


## GRADE 2 & 4 CODING CLUB
