Mental Health & Addictions

Depending on which Huddle you visit, counselling can be drop-in or appointment-based. Counselling may also be "one-at-a-time" or ongoing depending on Huddle site. Huddle is partnered with Shared Health Addictions Services to provide substance use counselling appointments to youth experiencing concerns around their own substance use or that of someone in their life.

Huddle sites also run frequent mental health coping skills groups. Groups can cover coping with depression, anxiety, anger, and many other concerns.



Recreation

Every Huddle site offers different recreation opportunities on most weekdays! This can include crafting, video game tournaments, dungeons and dragons, yoga classes and so much more! Check out your preferred Huddle site's calendar at <a href="https://doi.org/10.25/2016/bit.



Physical/Sexual Health

Huddle sites in Winnipeg have doctors and/or nurse practitioners on staff to provide healthcare to young people. Huddle sites may have walk-in hours, teen clinics, and/or appointments. Contact your preferred Huddle site for more information.

Some Huddles will also host occasional special health events such as STBBI clinics, vaccine clinics, and more!



Indigenous Supports

Depending on which Huddle you visit you may be able to access knowledge keepers, elders, indigenous language classes, ceremonies, and medicines. Contact your preferred Huddle for more information.



Peer Support

Huddle sites offer formal and informal peer support. Peer support is when youth are assisting other youth with their concerns. Peer support staff and volunteers can be a non-judgmental listening ear for youth who come to Huddle.

Nature Buddies

On May 29th Nature Buddies hosted room 3 from Norquay School for an afternoon of learning about trees.


We started the afternoon with a game of lichen tag, where we learned what a lichen is, their importance to the ecosystem, how they are affected by air pollution and how trees help dean the air and allow lichen to survive and grow.

In their first station, tudents learned about tree cookies (dendro disks) and how we use them to tell how old a tree is. Students also learned to look for fire scars and signs of injury in the tree cookies, as well the different layers in a tree trunk (heartwood, xylem, phloem, cambium, and bark).

In their second station, students learned how we identify a tree by it's needles, leaves and the type of seeds they produce.

In their last station students learned about insects that harm trees (Mountain Pine Beetles), and what to look for in signs that a tree may be struggling with a disease.

Many thanks to our Nature Buddies leaders (Damien, Kaylene and Ryerson) for their help in making the afternoon of learning amazing for our guests from Norquay School!
