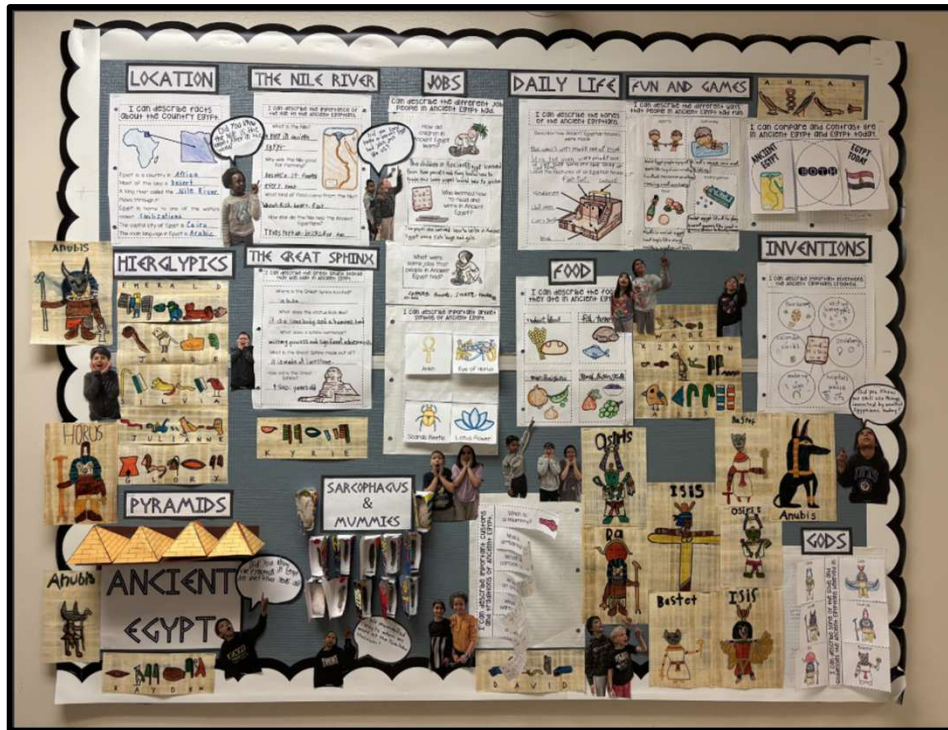


WELCOME to Rm 209

Dear Families,

Room 209 has just finished learning about our unit on Ancient Egypt as part of the Manitoba Grade 3 Social Studies curriculum: *Exploring an Ancient Society*. Throughout this unit, students travelled back in time to discover what daily life was like in one of the world's most fascinating ancient civilizations.

Students explored many aspects of Ancient Egyptian life, including homes, clothing, food, jobs, religion, celebrations, transportation, and the importance of the Nile River. They learned about pyramids, pharaohs, hieroglyphics, and famous inventions and contributions that continue to influence our world today. Students also investigated artifacts, stories, traditions, art, and architecture to better understand how Ancient Egyptians expressed themselves and what mattered most in their society.



Through hands-on activities, collaborative projects, reading, writing, art, and inquiry-based learning, students compared life in Ancient Egypt to life today. They had to think critically about how people's needs were met long ago and how traditions and ideas can continue across generations.

This unit encouraged students to build global awareness, deepen their understanding of history, and appreciate the lasting contributions of ancient civilizations.
