- On **May 7th** we had eight band students attend the WSD Band festival at Gordon Bell High School, forming a massive combined band of 150 students made up of students throughout the school division. They had a busy day learning new music and a great evening performance.
- On **May 14th**, fifteen Grade 5 students attended Manitoba Orff's Children's Day at the University of Manitoba. Students participated in workshops with drumming, movement, recorder and xylophone during the day, finishing with a late afternoon concert. The Orff Children's Day is an event designed specifically for Grade 5 students.
- On **May 19th**, a few Grade 5 and 6 students attended the WSD Upper Elementary choral festival. Students from many WSD schools came together for the day to learn a few songs, have sectional rehearsals, and share their learning with an entertaining afternoon concert.

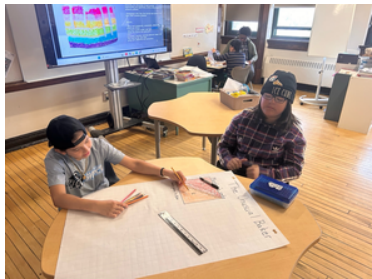


Room 304's Thinking Classroom

In today's world, mathematics demands more than just computational proficiency. It requires individuals to think critically and reason mathematically, allowing them to solve various problems and acquire new knowledge that will be vital in the future (A et al., 2011, p. 3).

A great way to enhance understanding of maths is by linking concepts to real life scenarios. I enjoy using storytelling in math lessons, such as engaging Grade 5 and 6 students with an authentic problem like 'The Unusual Baker.'

This time, students from Rm. 304 had the task of finding the fraction of a cake and its cost. Through this activity, students needed to apply critical thinking and draw on their prior knowledge. They had the opportunity to work collaboratively, make group decisions, and share responsibilities.



As I observe students engaging in mathematical discussions or working on a task, I constantly seek ways to ask practical questions that encourage them to explore the subject more deeply. By doing this, I aim to create a more engaging and productive learning environment.
